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SING YIN SECONDARY SCHOOL

Sing Yin Secondary School was founded at 11, On Tin Street, Lam Tin in September 1970 under the sponsorship of the Divine Word Missionaries. It was built and administered by Rev. Patrick Canavan who was its principal and supervisor for more than twenty years. Under Fr. Canavan's able leadership, Sing Yin quickly developed into a top quality school where students can receive a good, all-round education. On 1 September 2011, it moved to 38 New Clear Water Bay Road.

The Divine Word Missionaries, the sponsoring body of Sing Yin Secondary School, is an international Catholic society of priests and brothers. It was founded by a German priest, Fr. Arnold Janssen, in 1875 and China was the first mission of the society. In 1879, Fr. Joseph Freinademetz boarded a ship to Hong Kong and started his missionary work here. Fr. Arnold Janssen and Fr. Joseph Freinademetz were canonized on 5 October 2003 by Pope John Paul II. The Divine Word Missionaries has grown steadily and there are now over 6,000 priests and brothers working in more than 80 countries around the world.

Sing Yin Secondary School gets its name from the Bible. The Gospel of John opens with the words "In the beginning was the Word". This "Word" refers to the Son of God who became man in the person of Jesus Christ. For Christian, He is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Sing Yin is a Catholic school and, following the teaching of Jesus, special emphasis is given to moral education and community service. In this way, Sing Yin aims to give its students the best possible set of values by which to live a meaningful life and, at the same time, to become true pillars of society.

聖言中學簡介

聖言中學於一九七零年九月於藍田安田街十一號開校，為聖言會主辦的天主教學校。聖言中學是由甘百德神父籌辦和監建的，甘神父其後更出任本校校長及校監二十多年。在他的英明領導下，聖言中學迅速發展為一所優質學校，為學生提供良好、整全的教育。本校於二零一一年九月一日遷到新清水灣道三十八號現址。

聖言會乃一個世界性的天主教修會團體。它在一八七五年由德國神父楊生安諾所創立，並先在中國從事傳道工作。一八七九年福若瑟神父來到香港開始傳教。二零零三年十月五日前任教宗若望保祿二世為聖楊生神父及聖福若瑟神父封聖。聖言會穩健地發展，現今已有六千名以上的神父及修士在八十多個國家服務。

「聖言」這個名字是源自若望福音第一章「在起初已有聖言」。「聖言」是指天主聖子降生成人，就是耶穌基督。為基督徒來說，祂就是道路、真理、生命。

作為一所天主教學校，聖言中學遵從耶穌的教導，特別注重道德教育及社區服務。本校辦學的目標，正在於扶助學生確立一套圓滿的價值觀，以活得富有意義，並且成為社會的真正棟樑。

School Goals

Our goal is to prepare students to live a healthy, affluent and meaningful life. More specifically, we aim:

1. To help students to appreciate life and to develop a commitment to sustain all lives, especially human life forever. Thus environmental education should be a core goal of our education.
2. To help students consolidate the values and attitudes necessary for the development of moral character, such as: Faith, Hope, Love, Appreciation, Respect, Responsibility, Peace, Honesty, Justice, Self-discipline, Service, Co-operation, Simplicity, Courage, Perseverance, Sincerity, Tolerance, Self-Restraint and Delayed Gratification on which the sustainable development of the human race are based. These values are to be interpreted in the light of the Bible and good, traditional Chinese culture.
3. To strive to develop in our students the ability to think, judge, and act objectively and independently - that is, to be wise and rational. Critical thinking and debating skills are important, but students must know the shortcomings of these skills. On the other hand, we need to ensure that our students are sympathetic and be able to express their feelings in proper ways.
4. To enable our students to solve the problems they will face in life and societal problems, taking into consideration the pros and cons of different solutions and not be biased by advocacy opinions and other factors. The solutions adopted should be effective, efficient, fair and just.
5. To ensure that our students strive for a balance between their rights and responsibilities.
6. To guide the students towards finding meaning and purpose in their lives through an awareness of the existence of God and their obligation to serve God by developing their aptitudes in order to serve not just themselves but also to serve their fellow humans as members of God's great human family.
7. To provide for the full and proper formation of Catholic students.
8. To provide non-Christians with the opportunity of knowing about the life and teaching of Christ and to provide religious instruction for any non-Christian who freely desires it.
9. To promote respect for lawful government and its representatives, the observance of just laws, and a search for the common good which includes civic values such as freedom, social justice, and the dignity of work. Related activities should be appropriate to the developmental stages of students.
10. To vigorously promote voluntary service by the students both in and out of school.
11. To foster in our students a reverence for life in all its stages, an understanding of the significance of family life for the individual and for society, and the conditions conducive to a good family life. They should embrace filial duty, love their wives and care for their off springs.
12. To enable students to live a physically and psychologically healthy life now and after graduation.
13. To develop a challenging and comprehensive curriculum which will match the students interests and abilities and which will provide them with the knowledge, skills and attitudes which will enable them to have a better understanding of the world, become financially independent and capable of playing a positive role in the social and economic development of the community.

14. To help the students reach a good standard in both written Chinese and English, and to communicate fluently in Cantonese, Mandarin and English.
15. To provide the students with a basic knowledge of the society they live in, with special emphasis on the history and geography of China, and to cultivate in them a love of our Mother Country and Mother Earth.
16. To provide a chance for students to develop a basic appreciation of Art, Music and Chinese Literature and to foster interest in their Chinese cultural heritage.
17. To enable the students to understand the methods of Science, the influence of Science on human life, the main scientific facts, and the relationship of science to the Christian religion. We hold that science and religion are complementary rather than contradictory.
18. To develop leadership, career aspiration and personal interests of the students through extra-curricular activities.
19. To provide for the Pastoral Care of the Students with the assistance of the Social Workers and the Guidance Department.
20. To provide effective lines of communication among the administration, the staff, the parents, the students and the local community.
21. In the spirit of the Gospel to promote a pleasant, caring, family atmosphere within the school community which includes the Staff, the Students and the School administrators.

Most of these goals are further developed into two layers of sub-goals. At the fundamental layer, the spiritual, moral, cognitive, physical, social and aesthetic goals are of equal importance. At the higher layer, spiritual and moral goals come first, followed by cognitive goals. The social, physical and aesthetic sub-goals should be prioritized on an individual basis.

Summary Report

The 2023-2024 school year presented challenges for our school. With the return to full-day classes and the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions, all our programs, including a wide array of extracurricular clubs and activities, resumed. Principal Mr. Wong Chi Keung retired at the end of this year, and Dr. Hui Chi Kuen succeeded him as the new principal.

This year, a new examination system was implemented for Forms 1 to 5, consisting of three assessments: the first examination, the second examination, and the final examination. The results of these exams were weighed at 25%, 25%, and 50%, respectively, to determine the annual result, which was used for student promotion decisions. Additionally, F.3 classes included an extra lesson in Computer Literacy, and a new Biology group was introduced in F.4. Students recommended by their teachers could apply for local network programmes for both DSE Music and DSE Physical Education.

Academic Achievement

The 2024 HKDSE result was excellent, the percentage of Level 4 or above and Level 5 or above was 70.5 and 35.5 respectively. There were 13 students who were awarded 30 marks or above for 5 subjects. The 3 best students received 33 marks.

81.4% of our graduates were enrolled into degree programmes. 14.7% of our graduates were enrolled into associate degree or sub-degree programmes. Altogether, 96% of our graduates were admitted to universities and other tertiary institutes.

Achievement in Extra-curricular Activities

In our extra-curricular activities, students achieved remarkable success, winning a total of 328 prizes in local and international competitions.

Our Geography students excelled at the 13th Hong Kong Geography Olympiad, competing against 531 secondary school participants. They won 4 medals—1 gold, 1 silver, and 2 bronze—and earned the overall School Champion Award. Furthermore, Zhu Chi Yip (F.6) was selected to represent Hong Kong at the 2024 International Geography Olympiad in Ireland. Our team also won in the PolyU Science Young Talents Competition 2024, conducting advanced experiments in Biology & Food Science, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Physics. Our students Siu Tsz Hin Eric (F.4) and Ng Derek (F.2), both won the Bronze award in the International Mathematical Olympiad Preliminary Selection Contest – Hong Kong 2024. In the Hong Kong Hua Luo-geng Cup Mathematics Competition 2024, Ng Derek (F.2) also won the 2nd Runner-up.

In the Hong Kong Physics Olympiad, our team ranked second overall, with Chin Ho Yee (F.3) recognized as the Best Junior Student. Other notable awards included First Class Honours for Cai Ming Ho (F.4), Chin Ho Yee (F.3), and Siu Tsz Hin Eric (F.4); Second Class Honours for Yuen Cheuk Fung (F.4); and Third Class Honours for Chan Ngo Wang (F.4). In the Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics 2023-2024, Chan Ho Yin (F.5) won the Gold Medal, while Wong Chun Ming (F.4) won Bronze and Chan Lap Tsun (F.5) received an Honourable Mention. Additionally, at the National Olympiad in Informatics (NOIP) 2023, Chan Ho Yin earned Second Class Honour and Chan Ngo Wang (F.4) received Third Class Honour.

Our students achieved numerous awards in Choral Speaking and Dramatic Duologue at the 75th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival. Besides, our English debating team won the HKSSDC Grand Final Champion title in the 2023-2024 Hong Kong Secondary School Debating Competition. Moreover, a team nominated by the STEAM Education Committee won the Champion in the PolyU SCIENCE Young Talents Competition 2024.

With the support of the Students' Association, one of our students participated in the 'Hong Kong 200 Leadership Project' this year. His team's project won the championship in the 'Project for Hong Kong – Industry Aspect (Social & Business Sector)' category.

Our interest clubs also performed admirably. The Quiz Team earned the Champion in the Team (Secondary School) category at the 13th Hong Kong Students National Knowledge Contest, along with several other awards in various competitions, including the Champion and First Runners-up in the Junior Form Group and Champion in the Open Group of the 23rd Basic Law Online Quiz Competition. The Astronomy Team received a Champion title and another prize, while the Bridge Team achieved two Champions, three First Runners-up, and five Second Runners-up.

On the artistic front, our Brass Band, String Orchestra, and Percussion Ensemble won multiple awards, including a Gold Award in the Symphonic Band (Secondary School), a Gold Award in the String Orchestra (Secondary School), Silver Awards in Choir, Vocal Ensemble, and Ensemble (Percussion) (Secondary School) at the Joint School Music Competition 2024. The school choir formed a joint school choir with Kowloon True Light School choir and attained Gold Award in Secondary School Senior Division in Hong Kong Inter-school Choral Festival. The Dance Club and Acrobatics Team won Second Prize and 2nd Runner-Up, respectively, in their competitions. Student Tai Ka Hay Calvin (F.3) was the Champion in the Kwun Tong Fire Safety Committee Art Competition and Liang Shuang Ho (F.5) won the AI Image Champion title in the AI Image and Flash Fiction Competition 2024.

In sports, our teams maintained high standards in inter-school competitions. The Handball Team achieved Fourth Place in Grade A, Champion in Grade B, and Champion in Grade C, earning the Overall Champion in the Inter-school Handball Competition (Division II). Our Handball Team will be promoted to Division I in 2024-2025 school year. Our Athletics Team also won numerous prizes, including two Champions, two 1st Runners-up, and three 2nd Runners-up in Relay events. In the Inter-School Football Competition, our

B grade team finished as 2nd Runners-up and Overall 3rd Runners-up in Division 2. In addition, Chung Tak Chak broke the HKSSF record in 5000m run, and he was selected to be the member of the Hong Kong Team. The Table Tennis Team won the Champion title in Boys A grade at the Inter-School Table Tennis Competition (Division 3 Boys, Kln 2) 2023-2024, and it will be promoted to Division 2 in the coming school year. The Rope Skipping Team also obtained two Champions in Inter-School Rope Skipping Competitions.

Our students also actively engaged in community service. We participated in the 'Heart to Heart Project,' organized by the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups, marking our 18th year of involvement. Throughout the 2023-2024 school year, our students contributed a remarkable 39,068 hours of community service, both within and outside the school.

School Affairs

Attracted by the quality of education we provide, 294 primary students applied for discretionary places. However, due to a government cap on cohort size at 170, we were able to offer only 51 discretionary places. Through central allocation, 109 students were assigned to our school. To assist the new Form 1 students in developing study skills and adapting to school life, we conducted a Pre-S1 Summer Programme.

The total number of teaching staff is 64, including the Native English Teacher (NET) and the Principal. With the Teachers' Relief Grant, we employed one additional full-time teacher and a part-time teacher (0.5 contract). Altogether, we have 66 teachers for the 2023-2024 school year. Among the 64 teachers, by freezing the five Teaching Staff Establishment, 5 of them were employed with 1-year contract using the Teachers' Relief Grant. All teachers hold degrees, with 36 possessing a master's degree and two holding a PhD degree. With the Teachers' Relief Grant and Learning Support Grant, we employed 2 teaching assistants for Chinese and English Language support, and one teaching assistant for the Special Educational Needs (SEN). With the Capacity Enhancement Grant and Administration Grant, we employed 2 more teaching assistants—one for Pastoral Ministry and one to help in the Library.

The Principal and Vice Principals attended a workshop on "The Enhanced School Development and Accountability Framework 2023/24," held by the Education Bureau (EDB) on 11th December 2023. This workshop aimed to enhance schools' understanding of the rationale behind the enhanced SDA framework, thereby improving the effectiveness of school self-evaluation.

Vice Principal Mr. Hui Chi Kuen has been appointed as the Chairperson of the Committee for National Security Education. School-based materials and worksheets, including sources and publishing company names, were stored on the school intranet for teachers. Departmental program plans incorporated sessions on National Security Education, and various related activities and exhibitions organized through inter-departmental collaboration. All staff were required to attend the Flag Raising Ceremony, and the program

"Speech Under National Flag" was planned for launch in 2024-2025. Our school was paired up with 東莞市翰林實驗學校 in the Sister-School Scheme by EDB.

The 55th Anniversary Committee has been established, along with four sub-committees for the Thanksgiving Mass, Open Day, Performance Night and Anniversary Magazine. The 55th School Anniversary Thanksgiving Mass will take place on 17 January 2025, at Christ the King Chapel, followed by a Staff Lunch at The Regal Hong Kong. The 55th School Anniversary Open Day is scheduled for 28-29 June 2025, and the Performance Night will be held on 5 July 2025. Additionally, a 55th School Anniversary Magazine will be published during the 2025-2026 school year.

The IP Phones Project (Phase II) has been completed. IP phones were installed on teacher desks and in all classrooms to enhance communication between parents and teachers. Some extension numbers were rearranged.

To integrate core Catholic values across the curriculum, the Life Education Programme will cover all junior students and will become a regular program to promote positive values among them. The Physics Department has published a book titled "Questions and Solutions of Sing Yin Physics Olympiads" to promote participation in the Physics Olympiads and enhance our school's reputation. The new Student Handbook was designed to cultivate habits of timely task completion and effective planning, both of which are essential for success.

In the area of environmental conservation, we uphold our commitment to green practices and policies within our school. In addition, our students received Gold and Silver Awards in the Disaster Resilient Architecture Planning and Design Charrette and a Bronze Award in Sustainable Architecture Design Charrette 2024 organized by the Hong Kong Institute of Architects and the Hong Kong Federation of Youth Groups.

A Quality Education Fund (QEF) project focused on library improvement has been launched. The primary objective is to transform the library into a self-learning center for students, featuring a self-study area and a comfortable reading zone, as well as a cultural space and a discussion room to promote reading and support students' project work. Additionally, the Morning Reading Program has been initiated, featuring interesting articles suggested by Subject Department Heads compiled into a booklet for students to read every Wednesday morning. Another QEF project, aimed at creating a self-learning video archive of HKDSE multiple-choice questions, has also been approved. The Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry Departments are collaborating to produce video clips that explain these questions.

To improve the learning environment for our students, we have applied to the EDB for funding for major repairs, which include painting the walls and ceilings of all rooms, refurbishing all handrails, and replacing the pipework, including drainage and flush water supply pipes in the 5th floor pipe duct room. Besides, Student Association Office was renovated, it aims to enrich its historical ambiance and enhance students' sense of belonging. To achieve this, we have displayed the names of past presidents and cabinets. The gym

was renovated, with new equipment installed. Additionally, the English room was transformed into an English Café to further encourage students' self-learning.

It is with deep sorrow that we acknowledge the tragic loss of a Form 4 student who took his own life on campus in October 2023. In response, we have held workshops focused on mental health and suicide prevention. Emphasizing early intervention for emotional issues is critical, and we will arrange more workshops in collaboration with the social workers and educational psychologists to raise awareness among teachers.

By the end of the school year, Principal Mr. Wong Chi Keung retired. Mrs. Ngai Kan Yu Ting, Mr. Li Chung Man, Ms. Yeung Wai Ting, and Ms. Ho Suet Long resigned for personal reasons. We greatly appreciate their dedicated service.

Report on School's Major Concerns

There were three major concerns for the 2023-2024 school year.

1. To put the core values of Catholic Education into action

Achievements and Reflection

All departments were equipped to infuse core values of Catholic Education: 'Truth, Love, Life, Justice and Family' into both the formal and informal curriculum. A series of educational talks, workshops and sharing sessions were arranged for the teaching staff in different levels including new teachers, middle managers and administration parties to help teachers develop programmes for the students.

Educational talks for parents on the core values of Catholic Education were held by the Principal and the School Educational Psychologist on 28 November, 2023 and 7 December, 2023 respectively, and positive feedback was received. There were more than 100 parents attending each talk. The parents attempted to adopt the skills to help their children enhance positive values and communication skills.

Through the co-ordination of the school Catholic Education Committee, the talk on 'Putting the Core Values of Catholic Education into Action' was held for all staff and all students during the Religious Week in May, 2024 in the school hall. Another talk on 'Relationship between Parents and Children' was held by the Vice Principal in the school chapel in the Religious Week. With the help of the frontline Religious and Moral Education teachers, guidance teachers and class teachers, the sharing and follow-up sessions were conducted in the Religious and Moral Education lessons and the Class Periods organised by the Religious and Moral Education Department and the Guidance Department respectively.

During the Religious Week in May, 2024, the students put the core values into action by visiting the non-governmental organisation center in Choi Wan, sharing with the residents in Choi Wan with their hand-made cards. Also, mentally challenged children were invited to the school to share a warm and joyful Saturday with our students. Joint-activities with the elderly were co-ordinated with our school and the elderly centre. Parish-School co-operation programme on 'Education Day of Catholic Schools' also helped instill students' core values of Catholic education.

In the first year of the development cycle, F1 and F2 Life Education Programme was launched. The theme of F1 Life Education Programme was 'Nature and Me'. And the theme of F2 Life Education Programme was 'My neighbours and Me'. The Life Education Program has been extended to Form 3 in the second year of our development cycle. The theme was "Community and Me." This year, students participated in a service learning program organized by Caritas Hong Kong, learning to care for individuals with low incomes, and deepening their understanding of the core values of Truth, Life, and Love.

Class-based courses were arranged to prepare students for various volunteer services, including food bank food sorting, visits to old districts, and visits to low-income families. Students gained valuable learning experiences, which they shared and reflected upon in RME lessons.

To promote the atmosphere putting the core values of Catholic Education into action in an interactive way, elements were included in the junior form Integrated Science, F.1 students experienced the values of life, love and family in the chapter ‘Cells and Human Reproduction’. Students behaved well during experiments, showing respect for others and a pursuit for truth. The elements on putting the five core values into action were instilled in the lessons.

Another example came from the Geography Department. During the discussions about the causes and effects of global warming, unfair trade, deforestation and sustainable development, the core values of Justice, Truth, Love and Life were emphasized. Students were asked to buy products with the labels of Fair Trade, and to take action in their daily lives to save energy, save water and lead a low-carbon life to show care and love for the Earth and to sustain all life on Earth.

There are further examples from the cultural subjects. In the music curriculum, songs with the core values were introduced and students were encouraged to promote and put the values in action, for example, showing love to family through singing ‘Truly Love You’. Students showed their love of God through singing and performing in mass and prayer meetings. Through the co-operation and collaboration of the Visual Arts Department, a series of art appreciation lessons on the sculpture of ‘Pieta’ created by Michelangelo was arranged for F.1 students during the Religious Week. During P.E. lessons, positive values were instilled to the students in the sports events, emphasizing the importance of friendship, co-operation and fairness in competitions.

Functional groups, ECA clubs including the Catholic Society and committees organised regular school activities and programmes to help students put the core values of Catholic into action, for example, the household energy-saving competition was held and about 70 families entered the competition and a parent-student low-carbon cooking competition on video was organised by the Environmental Education Committee.

With the help of the Reading Across The Curriculum Committee (R.A.C.), books related to the core values were introduced by different sorts of media such as electronic signage of the library. Book sharing articles that promoted the core values were selected for display online. Also, book sharing sessions were conducted in Lau Pui Kee Library by the Vice Principal, the teachers and the students, for example, ‘Mother Teresa: Come Be My Light’.

Through the students’ service groups and programme, Catholic Society, Social Service Group, Sing Yin Pioneers and Boy Scouts, our students served 39,162 hours of social service in the school year, with an average of 41.4 hours per person.

Feedback and Follow-up

In view of the positive feedback and success of the Religious Week and the Environmental Week, the school would consider organizing family fun activities and competitions in the next year through the collaboration of Parent- Teacher Association.

Students will be encouraged to apply what they learnt from the core values through extra-curricular activities and service projects to the community.

Through the co-operation and collaboration among different departments, clubs and other parties, for example, Parent- Teacher Association, the programmes organised by the school Catholic Education Committee were successfully implemented in May. More parties will also be invited help the activities, for example, Alumni Association. Teachers will continue to refine a variety of activities to help students put the core values of Catholic Education into action.

2. To promote self-learning of students

Achievements and Reflection

Self-assess Online-Reading Programme for secondary school students were conducted with the help of academic departments, for example, the Chinese Language Department, the English Language Department and the Chinese History Department.

The feedback was positive with a satisfactory completion rate. In English Language, four senior form students attained the distinction and high distinction levels with Outstanding Student Awards in Hong Kong.

Extensive reading is one of the keys to achieving students' self-learning. In addition to the Extensive Reading Scheme, our school provided a variety of quality reading materials including newspapers and magazines both locally and internationally. A vocabulary enhancement booklet was designed every cycle. An online interactive English programme offered by Wiseman Education was arranged for F.1 to F.4 students and an online reading platform LightSail was provided for F.1 students.

Learning materials including video links of different subjects were created on Google Drive for all students by the Language Across the Curriculum Committee (L.A.C.). The list of videos were uploaded from department heads of E.M.I. subjects so that students could do revision on their own.

Four sessions on L.A.C. vocabulary were conducted during the Pre-S1 Summer Programme. In each session, students were taught the skills of syllable division, word stress, pronunciation and definitions of E.M.I. vocabulary from Integrated Science, Geography, History and Life and Society. This provided students with an opportunity to learn the strategies for spelling and familiarize themselves with the E.M.I. vocabulary before the beginning of the new academic year. The element of 'self-learning' of students was included in the early stage to prepare the Pre-S1 students to grow in an E.M.I. school.

Students learned through completing online tasks at their own pace on interactive and engaging online learning platforms. Teachers monitored their progress and tested students regularly, and provided assistance to weaker students.

In order to foster the reading habit of students as in the last year, each Wednesday, the school-based Morning Reading Programme was conducted by recently established Reading Across The Curriculum Committee (R.A.C.). Students stayed in the classroom with the subject teachers of the first lesson from 8:10 a.m. to 8:25 a.m. The articles in the reading booklet were selected by different departments, and some were written by students, for example, in the Economics Department.

Renovation work was started in June to improve the environment of Lau Pui Kee Library so that students could make good use of the space to self-learn. Students were interested in experiencing the new design of it.

The habit of self-learning could be developed through remedial lessons after school at the class –level, form-level and departmental-level. The lessons could help students to reach the standard and acquire satisfaction in learning, for example, in the Chinese History Department, Economics Department and History Department.

School-based video clips prepared by the teachers including M.C. questions and revision lectures of certain chapters were uploaded on Google Drive to assist in students’ self-learning.

Feedback and Follow-up

In view of the positive feedback and success of uploading video clips onto Google Drive, the school would consider extending this idea to other departments.

More articles written by the students could be recommended and selected by the departments for the Morning Reading Programme.

3. To enhance teaching effectiveness

Achievements and Reflection

All teachers, especially new teachers, were reminded of the ‘Training Requirements’ imposed by the Education Bureau (E.D.B.) in the staff meeting. A Vice Principal was assigned to monitor the progress of individual teachers’ professional development plans to align with the E.D.B. requirements.

The School Staff Development Committee regularly shared the information on training programmes and educational courses from different universities and organisations to all teaching staff via email messages and face-to-face introduction. The percentage of teachers who have completed the Basic, Advanced and

Thematic Courses was 43%, 11.1% and 20.6% respectively. Besides, there were 36.4% and 22.2% of teachers who participated in training themed on National Education and STEAM education respectively in 2023-2024.

Teachers of different departments received appropriate training and revised the curriculum content and teaching materials to align individual subjects with the aims, goals and content prescribed by the Curriculum Development Institute (C.D.I.).

The lesson plan sharing sessions and co-planning meetings were done with fruitful results. Teachers could learn from each other and share good teaching materials. Also, teachers had more discussions on the exam performance and discovered common mistakes of the students. The teaching effectiveness was assessed in terms of students' public examination results.

Teachers attended seminars organized by EDB. They shared the information obtained from these seminars in department meetings and informal meetings. There were also analysis on students' performance in tests and examinations in department meetings. Strategies for improving students' performance were discussed. Moreover, teachers shared teaching strategies and teaching in meetings.

Teaching sharing sessions and collaboration of lesson preparation were emphasized. Through interactive discussion and practical strategies, teachers were equipped to create more inclusive classroom environments. It highlighted the importance of a multidiscipline approach in addressing the varied needs of students.

Every teacher is provided with an iPad to enhance their teaching effectiveness. Useful Apps were purchased for all teachers. Techniques and tools (e.g. Explain Everything App) used to make educational video clips were shared among teachers. The use of Google Classroom is enhanced.

The collaboration between the History and English Department was facilitated in the school-based L.A.C. project offered by the Language Learning Support Session of the E.D.B. With the co-ordination of the E.D.B. officer, History and English teachers developed cross-curricular tasks for F.1 and F.3 students which at the same time help enhance teaching effectiveness.

Feedback and Follow-up

The materials and arrangements of the school-based L.A.C. project could be refined and adopted in the next year. Also, other E.M.I. departments could be invited to join the projects so that teaching effectiveness could be enhanced.

To promote teachers' professionalism, in-house professional workshops for different departments could be organised regularly. The peer lesson observation atmosphere could be further developed within departments and with other schools.

School Management and Staff Consultation

In the 2023-2024 school year, the school was managed, administered and operated by the Incorporated Management Committee in accordance with the Constitution laid down by the IMC which shall comply with the Education Ordinance and the code of aid for secondary schools.

The IMC was composed of 8 SVD managers appointed by the Sponsoring Body, 1 parent manager and 1 alternate parent manager, 1 teacher manager and 1 alternate teacher manager, 1 alumni manager and 1 independent manager.

The registered SVD Managers were Rev. Johnson Dhos, Supervisor and the Chairperson of the IMC, Rev. Paul Chen Zhong Xue, Rev. Balubun Anthonius Reynolds, Rev. Mullackal Chakkappan Manoj. Rev. Suryanto Natalius was the Alternate SVD Manager.

The Teacher Manager was Mr. Hui Chi Kuen and the Alternate Teacher Manager was Ms. Yang Ka Wah. The Parent Manager was Ms. Iong Un Lan and the Alternate Parent Manager was Ms. Leung Yuk Yin. The Alumni Manager was Mr. Lee Pui Keung and the Independent Manager was Ms. Fan Lai Mei.

Mrs. Kwok Cheng Mei Ling and Mr. Yung Lit Hung, the Vice Principals, attended IMC meetings by invitation.

Our school's administrative arrangements emphasize staff consultation. There were three consultative committees: the Academic Affairs Committee, the Student Support Committee and the Administrative Affairs Committee to discuss matters related to academic affairs, student affairs and staff welfare respectively. These three committees aimed at providing optimal opportunity for consultation between the principal and the teaching staff. Besides, staff meetings were held about four times per school year. Apart from reporting, these meetings also aimed to collect the opinion of teachers. After consultation, sometimes decisions were made by the principal. For important matters, the final decision was made by the IMC.

Routine decisions were made by the Principal and the Executive Committee. This committee made up of the Principal and the three Vice Principals met about once a week.

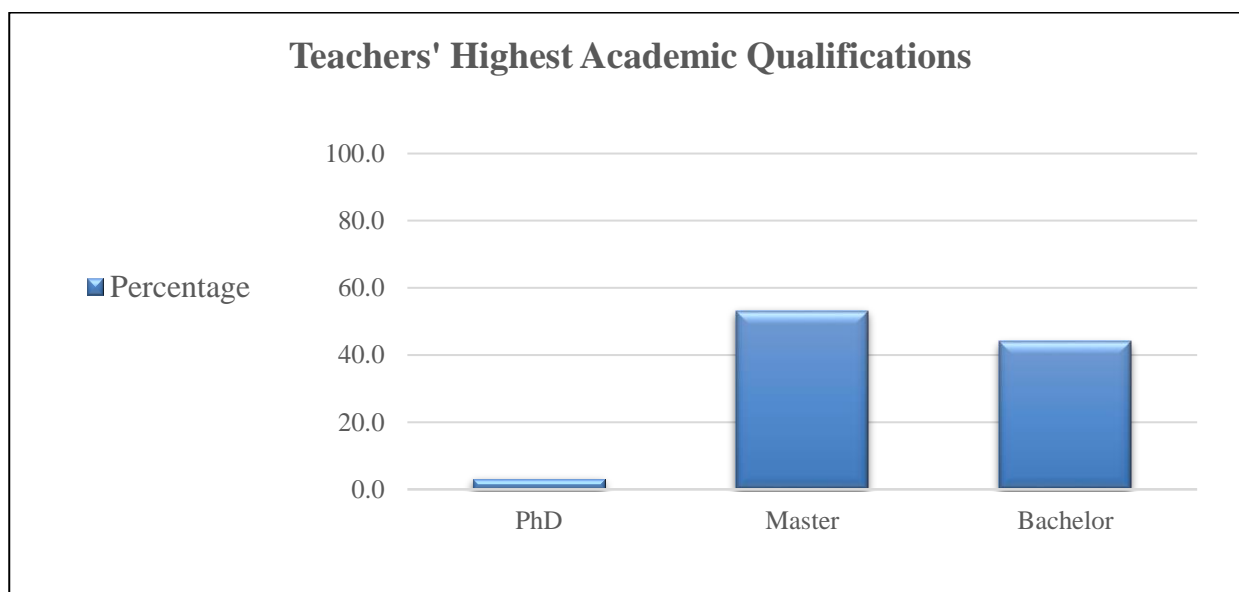
Staff Profile

a. Teachers' Establishment

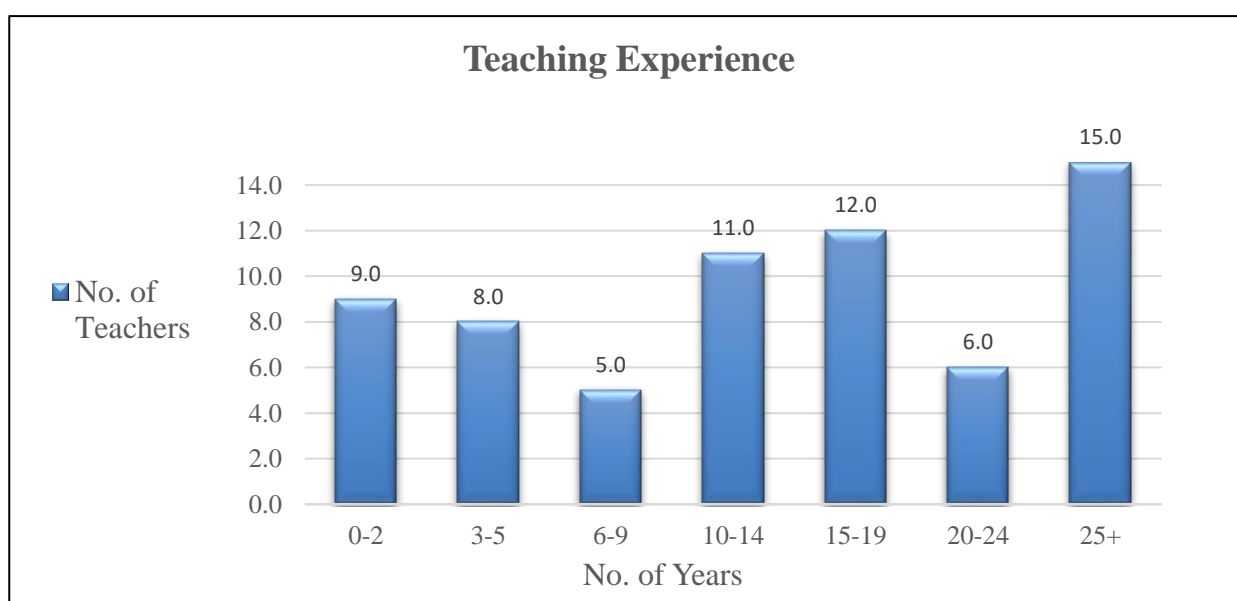
The number of teachers stood at 66. There were 31 male teachers and 35 female teachers. One of them was an English native-speaker and one was a part-time teacher. In addition, there were 4 technicians, 6 office staff members, 12 janitors and 6 teaching assistants. Among the teachers, 15 were Catholics.

b. Teachers' Qualification

Among the 66 teachers, all held bachelor's degrees, 2 had doctoral degrees and 35 possessed master's degrees. In addition, 63 had received professional training, and 44 had over 10 years of teaching experience. All English and Chinese teachers were subject-trained.

d. Teachers' Continuing Professional Development Report

This year, teachers dedicated a total of 2,420 hours to continuing professional development, averaging 37.81 hours per teacher. Three staff development days were held.

First Staff Development Day: 4 October 2023 - The day began with a morning session featuring two workshops. The first workshop was conducted by Ms. Chin Yuen Wai, Celine, an Educational Psychologist from the EDB. She introduced the concepts of special learning needs, identification strategies, and specialized teaching methods aimed at enhancing teachers' capabilities to support students with special needs. Following this, a Team Building Workshop was held to strengthen teamwork and foster positive relationships among staff. In the afternoon, the Reading Across Curriculum Committee presented the school library enhancement project. Rev. Dominic Lui Chi Man shared insights on the Core Values of Catholic Education, and the Principal provided a summary of the school's resources and educational philosophy, further enriching teachers' professional development.

Second Staff Development Day: 13 March 2024 - This session began with a golf clinic workshop at The Jockey Club Public Golf Course (Kau Sai Chau). In the afternoon, Principal Mr. Wong led a sharing session, followed by a discussion on the school's Three-Year Development Plan. This provided an opportunity for teaching staff to engage in strategic planning and align with the school's vision and priorities.

Third Staff Development Day: 5 June 2024 - The day commenced with a workshop focused on supporting students with Specific Language Impairment (SLI). This was followed by a session on stress management techniques for teachers. In the afternoon, Principal Mr. Wong shared valuable insights with the entire staff.

An online survey indicated unanimous agreement among teachers that the development programs were well-organized, achieved their objectives, and were both useful and inspiring. Additionally, over 95% of teachers expressed satisfaction with the overall arrangements and found the information applicable to their work.

e. Principal's Continuing Professional Development Report

In the 2023-2024 school year, the Principal logged a total of 538 CPD hours, exceeding the mandate of 50 hours.

For community service, he is now the Chairman of Catholic Diocese Diocesan Catechetical Centre, and Environmental Campaign Committee Education Working Group. Besides, he is the Board of Director of Conservancy Association, Vice Chairman of Catholic Religious School Council (Secondary School), Financial Secretary of Kowloon Region School Heads Association, and Kwun Tong Schools Liaison Council Committee, Members of Committee on the Professional Development of Religious Education Development of Religious Teachers, and Area Committee (Kwun Tong West) of Home Affairs Department. He is also the Leader of Faith Formation of Holy Cross Parish, and Tutor in Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults in Holy Cross Parish.

During 22 September 2023 to 27 September 2023, the Principal was invited by the EDB to have a tour to Cheung Sha in China to learn more about the recent development of Mainland China. During 1 May 2024 to 5 May 2024, he went to South Korea to learn more about sustainability development and education in other country.

Student Profile

a. General

On 1 September 2023, the student enrolment was 927, with 167, 166, 162, 154, 146 and 132 in F1 to F6 respectively. One of the reasons for the decrease of students was the students' withdrawal from school. 18 students withdrew during the school year.

About 77% lived in Kwun Tong District. 7% students are Catholics while most students did not have any religion. The median family monthly income was \$29,688.

b. Reading Habit

Students borrowed 2,332 books from the school library. The monthly average issue rate was 233. This statistics excluded the books loaned under the Extensive Reading Schemes, whose loan rate was 200. To ease the problem, students can borrow books of Chinese ERS and English ERS during Chinese and English lessons. This allowed students more time to choose books and could increase the number of book checkouts.

The class size in Form 1 has to be reduced according to EDB's regulation. This year the class size was 34.

All the allocated Form 1 students are basically in Band 1. Some of the students who were weaker in English and Chinese would be allocated in Form 1A. Double manning was adopted in the English and Chinese Language lessons. There is no streaming policy for Form 2 and 3. All the 5 classes in each form 2 and 3 are more or less of the same academic standard.

Streaming starts in Form 4 and students are allocated into 5 classes according to their preferences and their academic standards. Form 4 students have to study 4 core subjects – English, Chinese, Maths Citizenship and Social Development and 3 electives.

Curriculum

The design of our curriculum centers on our mission - to enable students to live a full life; a life that is healthy, affluent and meaningful.

To live a meaningful life, one must have proper values. In Sing Yin, we treasure Christian and good Chinese values the most. Consequently, we allocate two lessons per cycle throughout the 6 years of schooling on moral and civic education. These are supported by many other programs and activities outside of lesson hours.

Apart from moral development, we aim to provide a broad education through a balance of subjects. There is a balanced curriculum in academic and cultural subjects. Furthermore, a great variety of options of academic subjects are offered to our Form 4 to Form 6 students.

a. Religious and Moral Education

From the time it was founded in 1970, our school has always emphasized the moral development of our students through both formal and informal means. Moral Education is formally taught, with two periods per cycle, in all classes, from Form 1 to Form 6. In the mid-90s' with the approach of Hong Kong's return to China, Civic Education is incorporated with the objective of helping students to better understand and know our country. A range of activities is organized to foster moral development and civic duties of the students. These include Morning Reflection, weekly prayers, talks, visits and community services. Please refer to the departmental report for more details.

It is through formal teaching and various activities that help our students to develop into citizens who love themselves and their neighbour, set their eyes on the district, help build Hong Kong, care about their Mother land and embrace the world.

Our school aims to expand the horizon of our students' spirituality, to introduce them to Christian principles, values and beliefs and to help them find the meaning of life.

To develop our students' spirituality, we introduce our students to the Catholic faith and Christian beliefs through formal scheduled lessons, in which they have a chance to reflect and judge if these are worthwhile for themselves.

At the same time we try to deepen our Catholic students' faith and to introduce the joy brought forth by the Gospel to them through various religious activities.

Special programmes are organized for Catholic students every Tuesday afternoon to foster their faith. The Catholic Society also arranges retreat, Way of the Cross, visits and community service for its members. Other activities during the year may include: Prayer Service for the new school year; morning mass for F1 to F5 students; visit and caroling in "Home for the Aged"; and lessons for students interested in the Catholic faith.

The workload for catholic teachers is great. We employed a teaching assistant to help with the catholic activities. Rev. John Zhang Xinghao, S.V.D. was also kind to join us as a teacher for Religious and Moral Education since 2011. He was now the Head of RME Department.

b. Period Allocation For Subjects

The timetable is made up of a 6-day cycle consisting 48 periods. F4 to F6 students have 4 core subjects and 3 electives.

e. Medium of Instruction

Our school aims at trilingulism in English, Cantonese and Putonghua, and biliteracy in English and Chinese for all students. Of course the proficiency level expected for each of these languages differs. In spoken language, we expect students to speak excellent Cantonese, fluent English and reasonable Putonghua. In written language, we expect them to write excellent Chinese and English. English is adopted as the medium of instruction for all subjects other than Putonghua and Chinese subjects, P.E., Visual Art, and RME. An English Teacher was appointed as the Chairperson of the the English Language Across the Curriculum (LAC) Committee. Since 1999, a native-speaking English teacher (NET) has been employed to give additional support to other teachers and our students. Usually, during the summer holiday, a short English programme is organized for new Form 1 students. In 2010, the EDB announced the new policy “Fine-tuning of MOI”. However, we were not affected at all. Our present MOI is the same as before, that is, English is our major medium of instruction for all classes. Analysis revealed that our students’ academic achievement is not compromised.

Extra-curricular Activities

A wide range of activities is organized outside regular school hours. They provide students the opportunity to discover their interests and their creativity, discover their potential, develop their leadership qualities and improve their communication skills. All students are benefited by taking part in good leisure activities which will help them to be physically and psychologically healthy, and refraining from bad pastimes.

Through participation in extra-curricular activities, we aim at enhancing a sense of belonging and brotherhood of Sing Yin boys through horizontal and vertical integration of both teachers and students. Hence there is nothing “extra” about extra-curricular activities. Sing Yin looks upon these activities as an integral part of the education we offer. Students are expected to treat the activities just like formal lessons. For example, once they sign up for an activity, they have the duty to attend it. If necessary, they have to follow the procedures for asking for leaves.

Students are free to join the clubs. They are expected to be a member of at least one club and remain active members throughout the school year. F.1 to F.5 students should devote more time on ECA. They are encouraged to join one club for a number of years to deepen their knowledge and skill in a particular area that interests them the most. They should also join other clubs for a year or so to broaden their interests. F.6 students should put their focus back on their study, joining one club is an appropriate balance.

The Students' Association was set up in the mid-70s' and has since been playing a very active role in the school. Its executive committee is elected by students. Apart from serving as a bridge between the students and the school by reflecting students' opinion and making suggestions for the welfare of the students, it also provides services and organizes many activities such as the sale of stationary, subscription and distribution of newspaper, blood donation, and many others.

There were 60 ECA clubs to cater for different interests of students. The academic clubs provide opportunities for students to gain knowledge and experience to supplement the formal curriculum. The interest clubs provides chances for students to take part in inter-school competitions, to participate in outdoor activities, visits and outdoor training and fund-raising activities. The Catholic Society organizes weekly Catholic lessons and religious activities for the faith formation of Catholic students, guide students to discover Christian values and beliefs; and to enhance their spiritual and moral development. The Community Service Group organizes activities for the community. Through these real life experiences, our students are enriched with the best possible set of values by which to live a meaningful life. The Sing Yin Pioneers, the Catholic Society, Scouts, the Student Association also organize community service programmes.

There are post-exam activities for F1- F5 students. The activity programme is organized after the final exam in early July. The activities include talks on topics of interest, cultural performance, quizzes, singing contest, sports games, visits and field trips, etc. In the 60 ECA clubs, there were 2179 members. On average, each student joined 2.32 clubs. The total club expenditure was \$31,165.73. Please note that the total expenditure excluded the costs/fees of training courses, which were much higher than these expenses.

Support For Students

Sing Yin adopts a whole school approach to support students. Every staff member- teachers, office staff, teaching assistants, and janitors are there to help our students. Students are also encouraged to help fellow schoolmates. Students in need can approach any staff member or suitable fellow students for help. Of course, there are times when professional help should be provided. In these cases, students will be referred to our school social workers.

For daily life problems, students can approach fellow students for help. Our Sing Yin Pioneers, Prefects, Student Association and Club officials are all there to help. Of course, Class Teacher and subject teachers are there to help too.

Any student who wishes to talk over personal problem is encouraged to do so with his Class Teacher. However, if the student should, for any reason, prefer to talk to someone other than his Class Teacher, he may approach his subject teachers or a member of the departments listed below.

- a. Guidance Department - it aims to help students develop positive self-concepts, achieve personal growth and interpersonal skills, and realize their own potential to the full. A team of counseling teachers, together with the social worker, organize and conduct both preventive and developmental programmes for the students to achieve these objectives. The programmes include personal growth groups, peer tutoring groups, leadership training programmes and orientation programmes. The Department also organizes Parents' Day to promote better communication between school and parents. All along the school adopts the "Whole School Approach to Guidance" to provide better service to the students.
- b. Careers Department - it aims to prepare students to make sound decisions on further education and career opportunities. Through visits to organizations and exhibitions, talks, seminars, information on education, employment and training opportunities is disseminated to assist students in making the right choice.

- c. Discipline Department - it aims to ensure good manners and good order in each classroom and throughout the school, to foster a healthy school culture in which effective teaching and learning can take place. Students are encouraged to develop self-discipline, to respect the rights and property of others and to attain a high standard of behaviour. They shall be responsible for their own behaviour and breaches of school rules may incur some penalty. However punishment will be accompanied by efforts to teach students the appropriate behaviour so that they can learn to be self-disciplined. As a preventive measure our school is adopting the Whole School Approach to Guidance and Discipline whereby all teachers participate actively in assisting students to resolve their problems. Students who suffer from discipline problems can approach any teachers for help. If necessary, they will be referred to discipline team members.
- d. Health & Safety Department
We also have a team of teachers to provide guidance on health related problems. They give advice students on physical health, mental health and fitness issues.
- e. Financial Support to students
Besides emotional support, we also offer financial support to our students. Using government funds, donated funds or our own funds, we offer financial subsidy for needy students to support their extra-curricular activities organized by Sing Yin, including training courses, study tours and graduate dinners. In particular, in the 2023-24 school year, \$196,344.00 from the School-based After-school Learning and Support Programme was used to subsidize 41 needy students. The \$105,835.00 from the Student Activities Support Grant helped subsidize 170 students. Their personal and social development and community involvement improved moderately.

Students' Performance

a. Students' Service

Students have the opportunity to take up voluntary social service through the Community Service Group, Community Youth Club, Sing Yin Pioneers, Catholic Society and Boy Scouts. Other organizations also contribute. Moreover, students have abundant chances to serve their fellow schoolmates in school.

This year, through the five groups mentioned above and programmes run by the Community Services Department, our students provided 39068 hours of social service in this school year, with an average of 42.1 hours per person. The service hour exceeded the standard of 2000 hours set by the Heart to Heart Programme organized by the Hong Kong Federation of Youth, which we joined in 2006.

On the Dress Casual Day (30/10/2023), the Students' Association raised a total amount of \$7293.5. The Blood Donation Day originally scheduled on 09/01/2024 was cancelled due to the low participation rate.

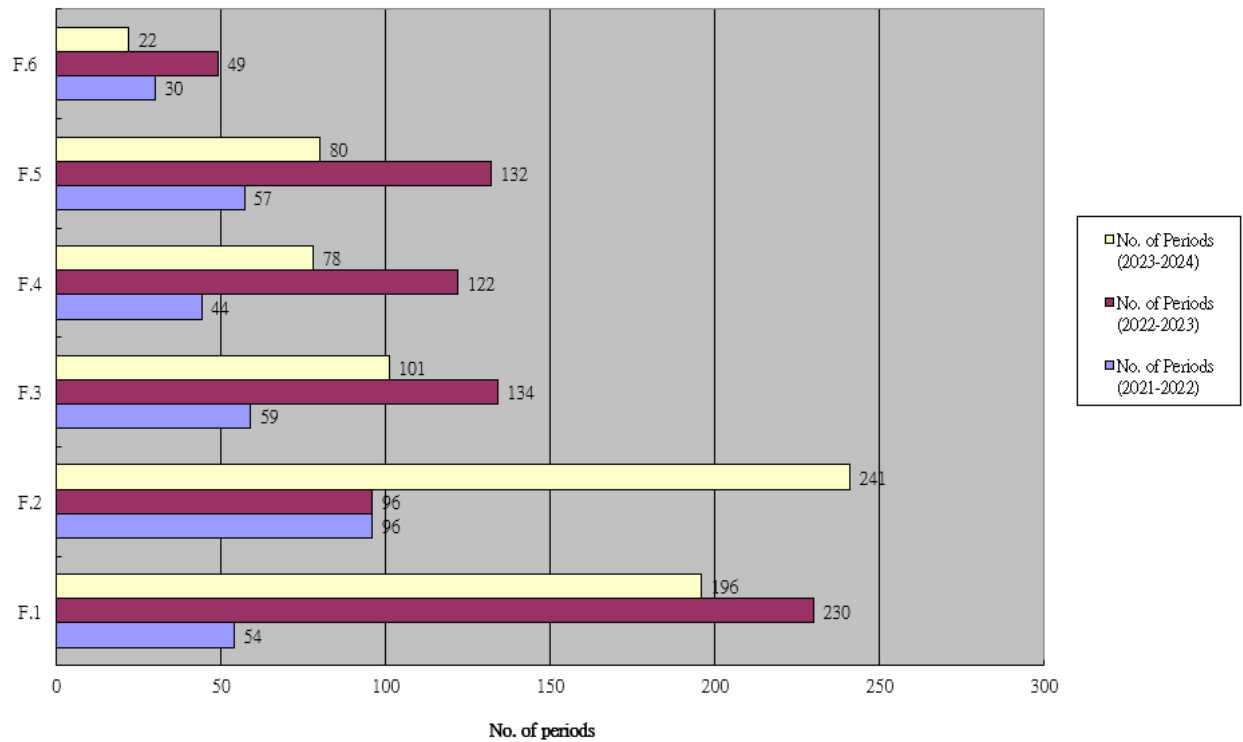
b. Students' Discipline

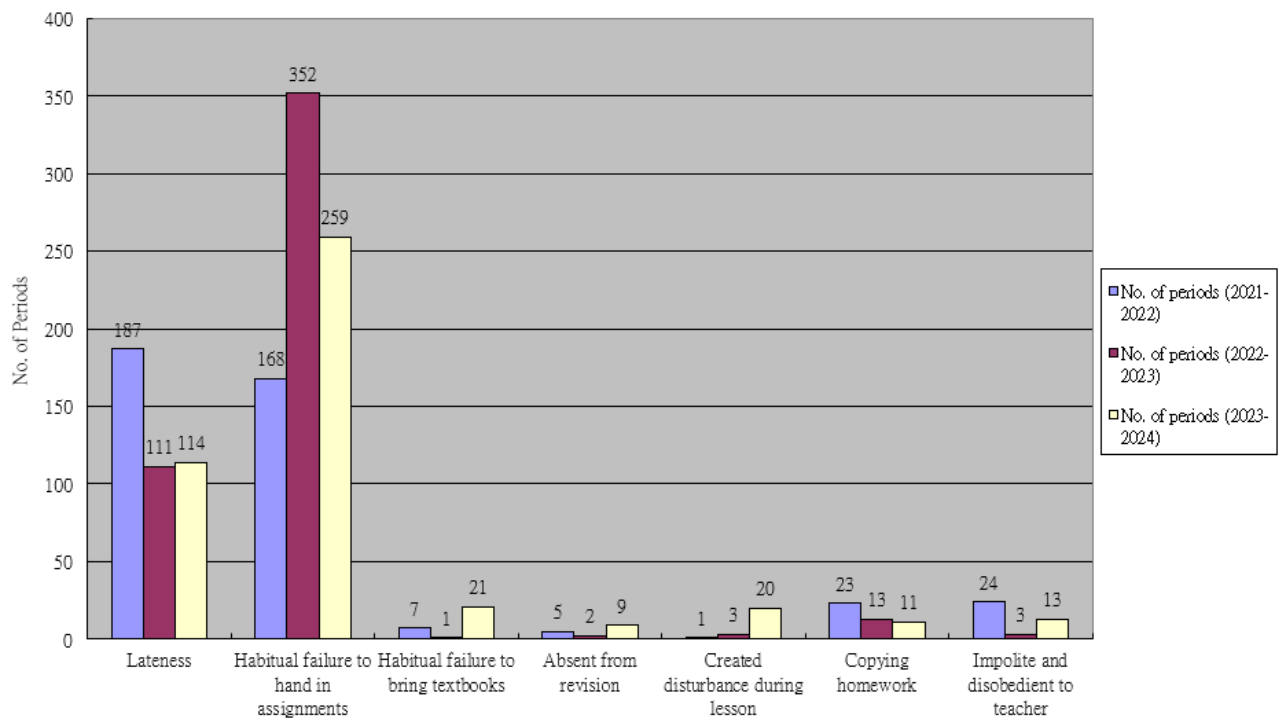
Through these efforts and all our teachers' efforts, our students behaved very well. Their attendance rates and punctuality rates stood above 97% and 99% respectively.

The number of suspension from lessons was 16 and detention periods on Saturdays was 718. 36.1% of the offending students were detained because they failed to hand in their assignments habitually.

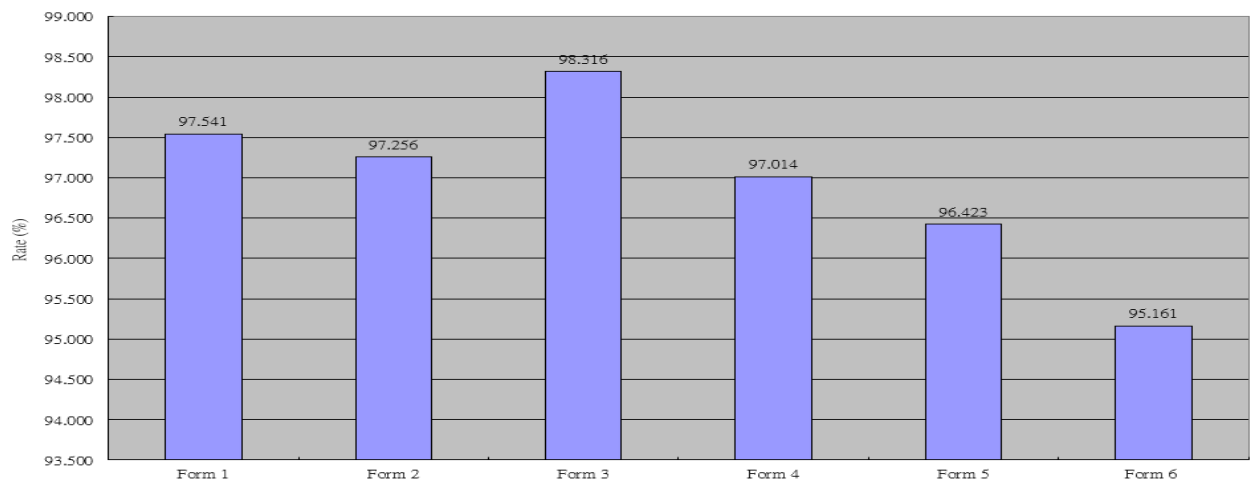
Distribution of the detention periods on Saturdays (2021-2024)



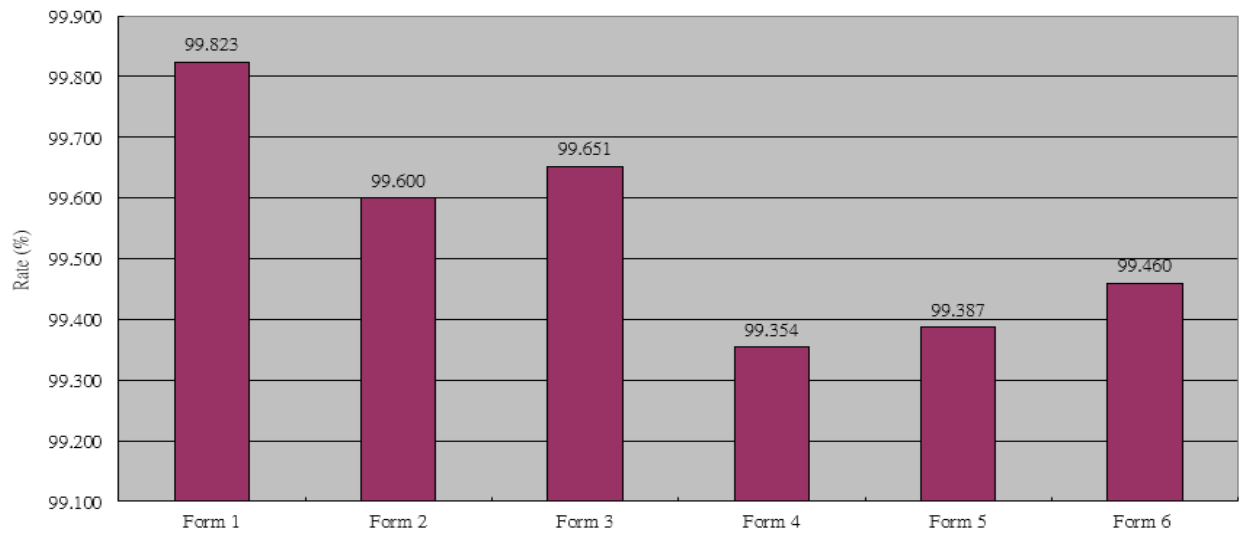
Common Reasons of the Students to have periods of Detention (2021-2024)



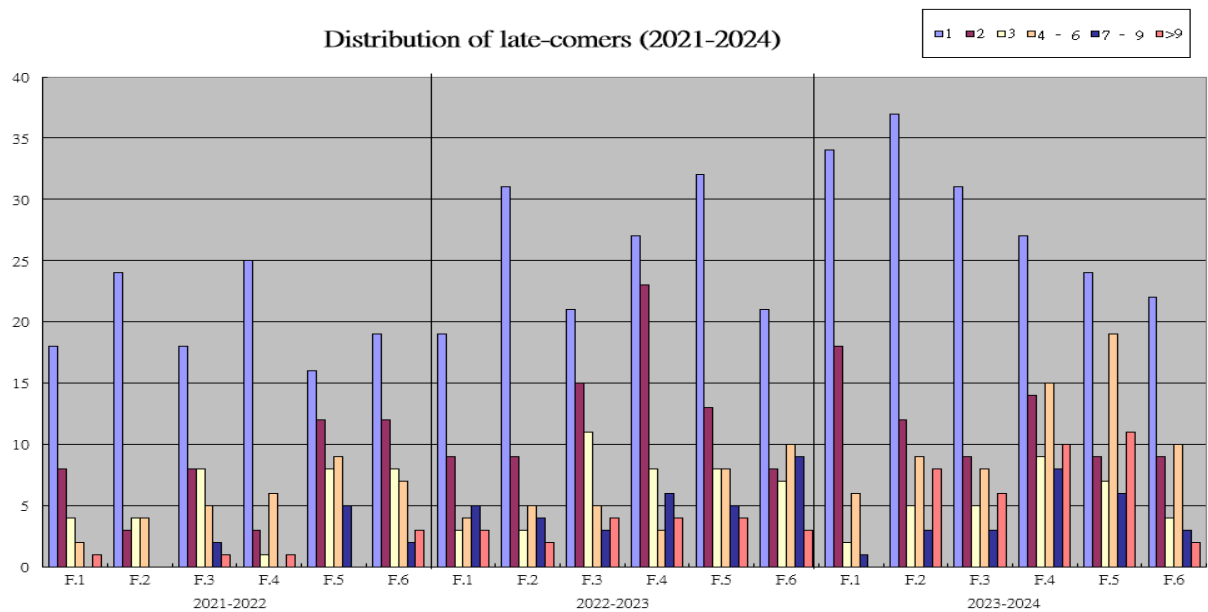
Attendance Rate of Student in 2023-2024



Punctuality Rate of Student in 2023-24



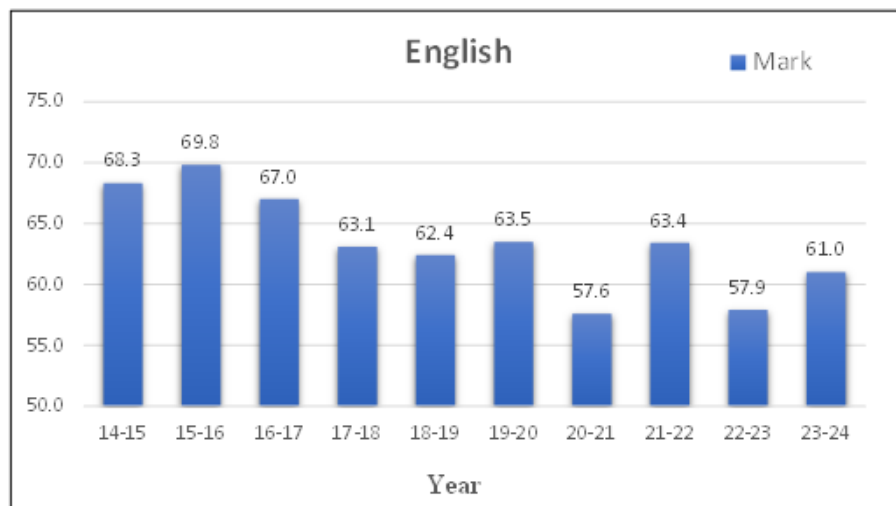
Distribution of late-comers (2021-2024)

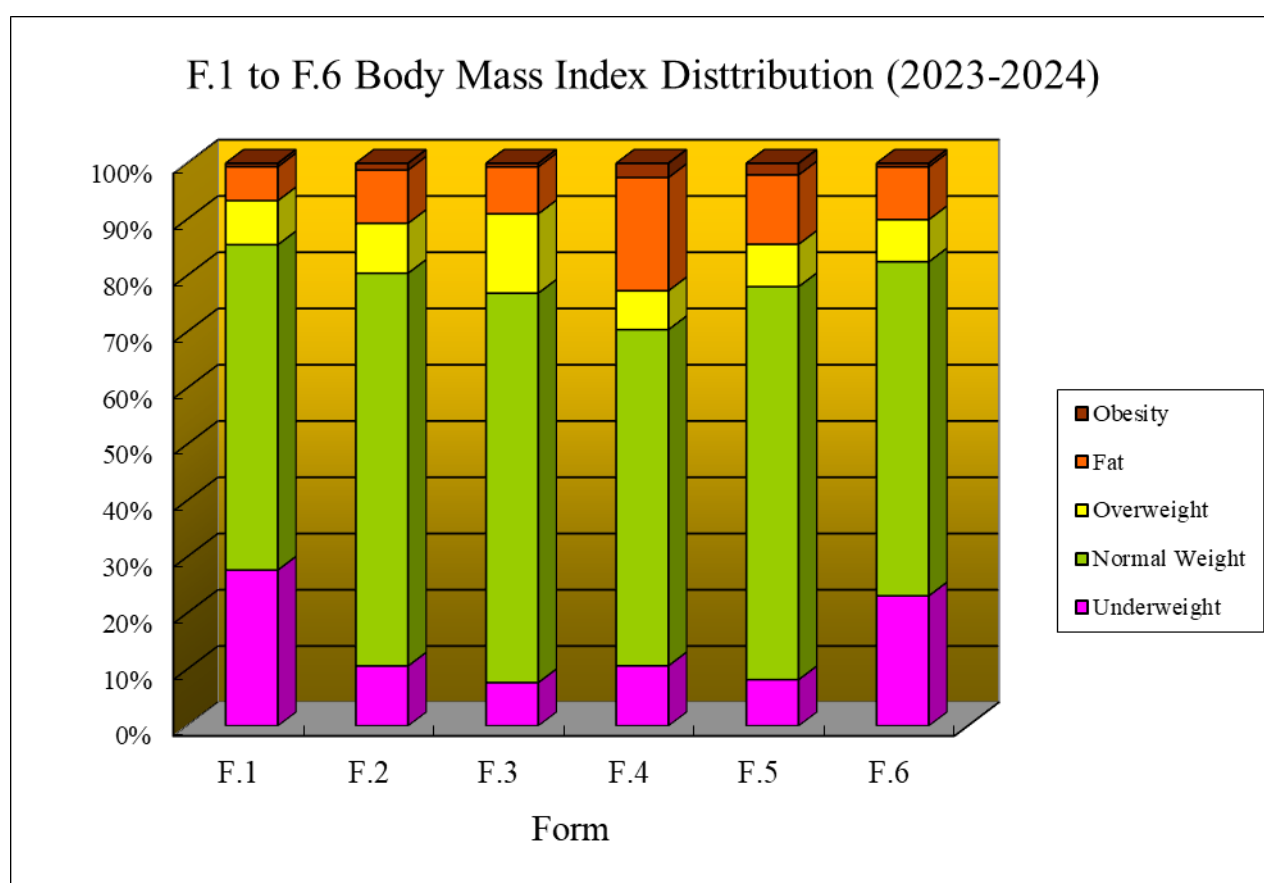

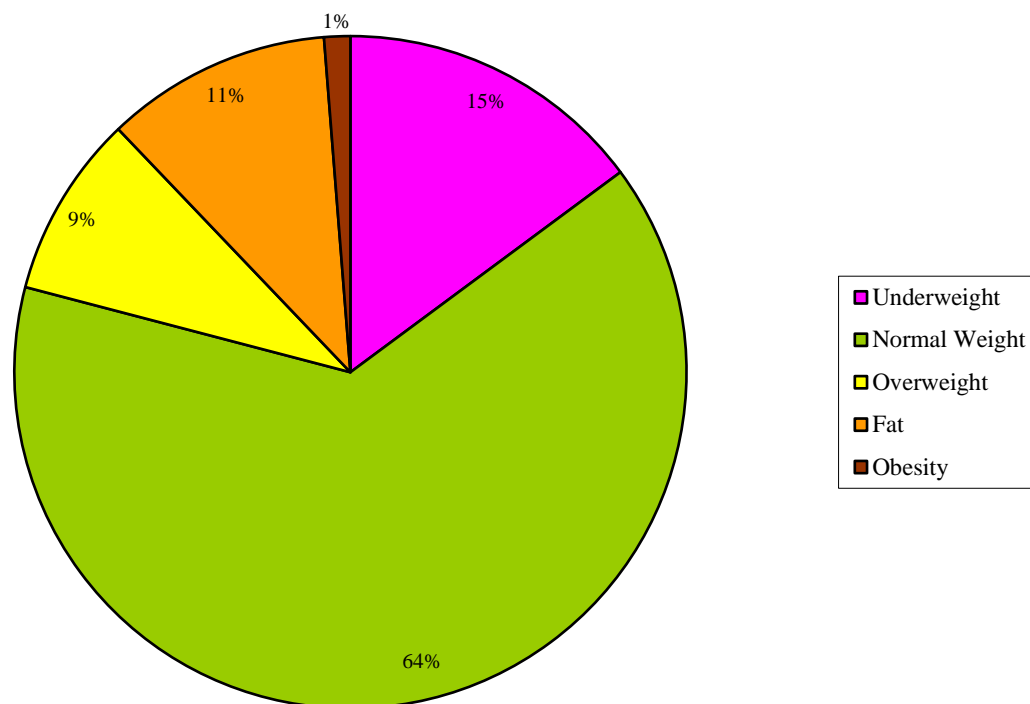

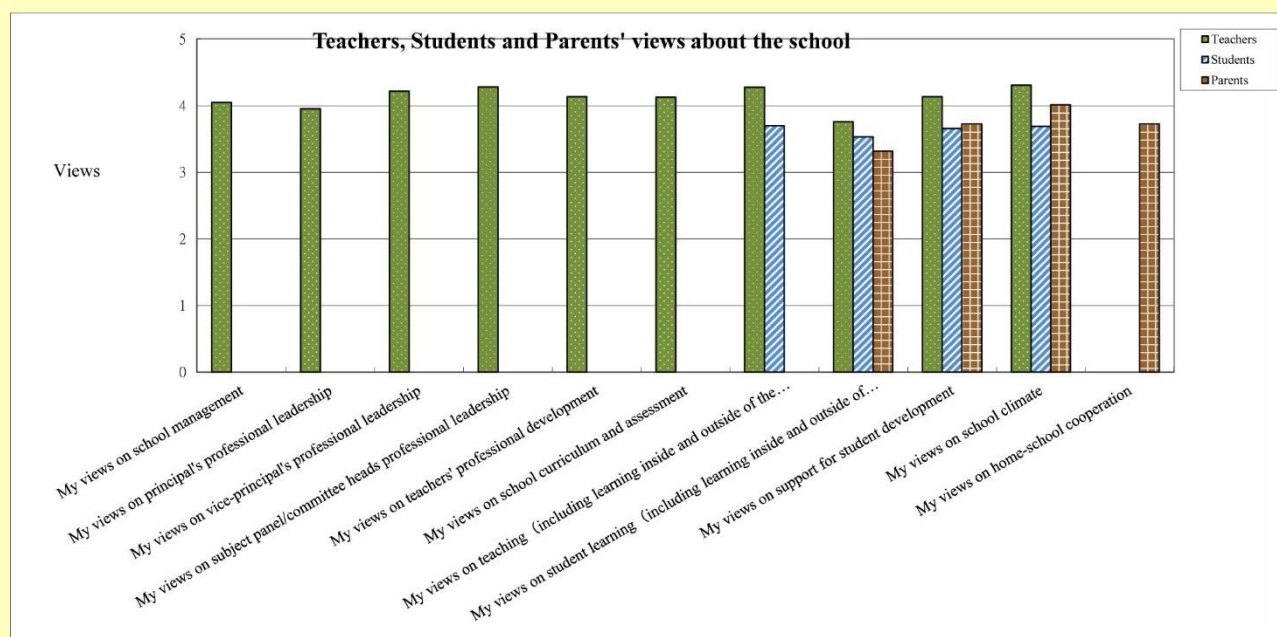
