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SING YIN SECONDARY SCHOOL

Sing Yin Secondary School was founded at 11, On Tin Street, Lam Tin in September 1970 under the sponsorship of the Divine Word Missionaries. It was built and administered by Rev. Patrick Canavan who was its principal and supervisor for more than twenty years. Under Fr. Canavan's able leadership, Sing Yin quickly developed into a top quality school where students can receive a good, all-round education. On 1 September 2011, it moved to 38 New Clear Water Bay Road.

The Divine Word Missionaries, the sponsoring body of Sing Yin Secondary School, is an international Catholic society of priests and brothers. It was founded by a German priest, Fr. Arnold Janssen, in 1875 and China was the first mission of the society. In 1879, Fr. Joseph Freinademetz boarded a ship to Hong Kong and started his missionary work here. Fr. Arnold Janssen and Fr. Joseph Freinademetz were canonized on 5 October 2003 by Pope John Paul II. The Divine Word Missionaries has grown steadily and there are now over 6,000 priests and brothers working in more than 80 countries around the world.

Sing Yin Secondary School gets its name from the Bible. The Gospel of John opens with the words "In the beginning was the Word". This "Word" refers to the Son of God who became man in the person of Jesus Christ. For Christian, He is the Way, the Truth and the Life.

Sing Yin is a Catholic school and, following the teaching of Jesus, special emphasis is given to moral education and community service. In this way, Sing Yin aims to give its students the best possible set of values by which to live a meaningful life and, at the same time, to become true pillars of society.

聖言中學簡介

聖言中學於一九七零年九月於藍田安田街十一號開校，為聖言會主辦的天主教學校。聖言中學是由甘百德神父籌辦和監建的，甘神父其後更出任本校校長及校監二十多年。在他的英明領導下，聖言中學迅速發展為一所優質學校，為學生提供良好、整全的教育。本校於二零一一年九月一日遷到新清水灣道三十八號現址。

聖言會乃一個世界性的天主教修會團體。它在一八七五年由德國神父楊生安諾所創立，並先在中國從事傳道工作。一八七九年福若瑟神父來到香港開始傳教。二零零三年十月五日前任教宗若望保祿二世為聖楊生神父及聖福若瑟神父封聖。聖言會穩健地發展，現今已有六千名以上的神父及修士在八十多個國家服務。

「聖言」這個名字是源自若望福音第一章「在起初已有聖言」。「聖言」是指天主聖子降生成人，就是耶穌基督。為基督徒來說，祂就是道路、真理、生命。

作為一所天主教學校，聖言中學遵從耶穌的教導，特別注重道德教育及社區服務。本校辦學的目標，正在於扶助學生確立一套圓滿的價值觀，以活得富有意義，並且成為社會的真正棟樑。

School Goals

Our goal is to prepare students to live a healthy, affluent and meaningful life. More specifically, we aim:

1. To help students to appreciate life and to develop a commitment to sustain all lives, especially human life forever. Thus environmental education should be a core goal of our education.
2. To help students consolidate the values and attitudes necessary for the development of moral character, such as: Faith, Hope, Love, Appreciation, Respect, Responsibility, Peace, Honesty, Justice, Self-discipline, Service, Co-operation, Simplicity, Courage, Perseverance, Sincerity, Tolerance, Self-Restraint and Delayed Gratification on which the sustainable development of the human race are based. These values are to be interpreted in the light of the Bible and good, traditional Chinese culture.
3. To strive to develop in our students the ability to think, judge, and act objectively and independently - that is, to be wise and rational. Critical thinking and debating skills are important, but students must know the shortcomings of these skills. On the other hand, we need to ensure that our students are sympathetic and be able to express their feelings in proper ways.
4. To enable our students to solve the problems they will face in life and societal problems, taking into consideration the pros and cons of different solutions and not be biased by advocacy opinions and other factors. The solutions adopted should be effective, efficient, fair and just.
5. To ensure that our students strive for a balance between their rights and responsibilities.
6. To guide the students towards finding meaning and purpose in their lives through an awareness of the existence of God and their obligation to serve God by developing their aptitudes in order to serve not just themselves but also to serve their fellow humans as members of God's great human family.
7. To provide for the full and proper formation of Catholic students.
8. To provide non-Christians with the opportunity of knowing about the life and teaching of Christ and to provide religious instruction for any non-Christian who freely desires it.
9. To promote respect for lawful government and its representatives, the observance of just laws, and a search for the common good which includes civic values such as freedom, social justice, and the dignity of work. Related activities should be appropriate to the developmental stages of students.
10. To vigorously promote voluntary service by the students both in and out of school.
11. To foster in our students a reverence for life in all its stages, an understanding of the significance of family life for the individual and for society, and the conditions conducive to a good family life. They should embrace filial duty, love their wives and care for their off springs.

12. To enable students to live a physically and psychologically healthy life now and after graduation.
13. To develop a challenging and comprehensive curriculum which will match the students interests and abilities and which will provide them with the knowledge, skills and attitudes which will enable them to have a better understanding of the world, become financially independent and capable of playing a positive role in the social and economic development of the community.
14. To help the students reach a good standard in both written Chinese and English, and to communicate fluently in Cantonese, Mandarin and English.
15. To provide the students with a basic knowledge of the society they live in, with special emphasis on the history and geography of China, and to cultivate in them a love of our Mother Country and Mother Earth.
16. To provide a chance for students to develop a basic appreciation of Art, Music and Chinese Literature and to foster interest in their Chinese cultural heritage.
17. To enable the students to understand the methods of Science, the influence of Science on human life, the main scientific facts, and the relationship of science to the Christian religion. We hold that science and religion are complementary rather than contradictory.
18. To develop leadership, career aspiration and personal interests of the students through extra-curricular activities.
19. To provide for the Pastoral Care of the Students with the assistance of the Social Workers and the Guidance Department.
20. To provide effective lines of communication among the administration, the staff, the parents, the students and the local community.
21. In the spirit of the Gospel to promote a pleasant, caring, family atmosphere within the school community which includes the Staff, the Students and the School administrators.

Most of these goals are further developed into two layers of sub-goals. At the fundamental layer, the spiritual, moral, cognitive, physical, social and aesthetic goals are of equal importance. At the higher layer, spiritual and moral goals come first, followed by cognitive goals. The social, physical and aesthetic sub-goals should be prioritized on an individual basis.

Summary Report

The 2024-2025 school year was one of many accomplishments. It marked the 150th Anniversary of our school's sponsoring body as well as our school's 55th Anniversary. A series of 55th Anniversary events were successfully held, and a fundraising program for the Sing Yin Secondary School Education Foundation was initiated. To date, over \$1.5 million has been raised. Our 2025 HKDSE results were strong. In extra-curricular activities, our students won a total of 403 prizes in inter-school competitions. The APASO results revealed that our students shared the values we treasure, while a stakeholder survey showed that our parents, students, and teachers hold us in high regard.

Academic Achievement

The 2025 HKDSE result was good, the percentage of Level 4 or above and Level 5 or above was 65.8 and 28.5 respectively. There were 9 students who were awarded 30 marks or above for 5 subjects. The 2 best students received 33 marks.

75.9% of our graduates were enrolled into degree programmes. 21.3% of our graduates were enrolled into associate degree or sub-degree programmes. Altogether, 97.7% of our graduates were admitted to universities and other tertiary institutes.

Achievement in Extra-curricular Activities

In our extra-curricular activities, students achieved remarkable success, winning a total of 403 prizes in local and international competitions.

Our students have consistently achieved significant success in various competitions, including international ones. Chan Ngo Wang (F.5) represented Hong Kong in the 18th International Olympiad on Astronomy and Astrophysics held in Mumbai, India, and got an Honorable Mention for his excellent performance. Chin Ho Yee (F.4) represented Hong Kong in the 25th Asian Physics Olympiad held in Dhahran, Saudi Arabia, and got an Honorable Mention for his excellent performance.

Our Geography students excelled at the 14th Hong Kong Geography Olympiad, competing against over 500 secondary school participants. They won 5 medals—1 silver, and 4 bronze. Furthermore, Chan Long Yu (F.5) was selected to represent Hong Kong at the 21st International Geography Olympiad in Thailand.

Our students also showed remarkable performance in Informatics and Coding. At the Hong Kong Secondary School Coding Challenge 2025, Chan Ho Yin (F.6), Huang Chi Ki Long (F.5), and Cheung Kin Sun (F.4) won the Silver Medal, alongside four students who earned Bronze Medals. The Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics (HKOI) 2024/25 brought even more accolades, with Chan Ho Yin receiving a Gold Medal in the Senior Group. Other notable achievements include a Silver Medal for Chan Ngo Wang and a Bronze Medal for Huang Chi Ki Long in the Senior Group, with Chen Chun Wang (F.4) and Cheung Kin Sun (F.4) taking home Bronze Medals in the Junior Group. Furthermore, at the International Junior Science Olympiad 2025 - Hong Kong Screening, four students were awarded Second Class Honours, and two students were awarded the Third Class Honours.

In English, two of our students participated in the Animal Photopoetry Challenge, co-organized by the EDB English Language Education Section and the Arts Education Section in

collaboration with Ocean Park Hong Kong. Tin Fong Ho received the Outstanding Award, while Chan Kwan Nock Enoch earned the Commendable Award. Additionally, our students achieved numerous accolades in Choral Speaking and Dramatic Duologue at the 76th Hong Kong Schools Speech Festival. Furthermore, our English debating team secured the first runner-up position in the HKSSDC Grand Final for the 2024-2025 season, with Siu Cheuk Fung (F.3) being awarded Best Speaker in the Hong Kong Secondary School Debating Competition.

Five Form Three students joined the 13th Inter-school Competition of Project Learning on Hong Kong's History and Culture, and won the Championship of the Junior Division (Written Report) in the competition held by The Hong Kong Museum of History & The Hong Kong Institute for Promotion of Chinese Culture.

The performance of our interest clubs was also impressive. The Quiz Team earned the Champion in the Team (Secondary School) category at the 14th Hong Kong Students National Knowledge Contest, along with several other awards in various competitions, including the Champion in the Inter-school Labour Legislation and Occupational Safety Quiz Competition and other prizes in the “Safeguarding National Security in Hong Kong” Quiz Competition 2024 and Occupational Safety & Health Quiz Competition 2025. Besides, the Astronomy Team received a Champion title and another prize in the Hong Kong Interschool Astronomy Quest 2025.

On the artistic front, our Brass Band, String Orchestra, and Symphonic Band won multiple awards, including a Gold Award in the Symphonic Band (Secondary School), a Gold Award in the String Orchestra (Secondary School), Silver Awards in Choir, Group Ensemble (Singing) and Vocal Duet (Secondary School) at the Joint School Music Competition 2025. The school choir formed a joint school choir with Kowloon True Light School choir and attained Silver Award in the Hong Kong Inter-school Choral Festival. Furthermore, the String band attained bronze award in String orchestra intermediate and our students have attained 12 silver awards and eight bronze awards in the Music Festival. Hong Kong School Drama Festival 2024/25 held by the Education Bureau, our Drama Team received the awards for Outstanding Script, Outstanding Director, Outstanding Performer, Outstanding Stage Effects, and Outstanding Cooperation. Furthermore, we won the Award for Commendable Overall Performance in the competition. In the Hong Kong Academic Anti-Fraud Drama Invitational Competition held by the Hong Kong Police Force, we won the Champion (Secondary Section) out of the 58 schools.

In sports, our teams maintained high standards in inter-school competitions. The Handball Team achieved Fourth Place in all three grades: A, B, and C. Consequently, we secured overall Fourth Place in the Inter-school Handball Competition (Division I). The team also achieved Fourth Place in the Biore All Hong Kong Schools Jing Ying Handball Tournament. Our school Football Team Won the Inter-school Football Competition (Division 2) Boys Overall 1st Runner-up and will compete in the 2025-2026 Inter-school Football Competition (Division 1). Besides, our school Badminton Team won the Boys Fourth Place in Grade A, Boys Second Place in Grade C and the Overall Champion in Hong Kong Inter-School Badminton (Division 2) Competition. The team will compete in the 2025-2026 Inter-school Badminton Competition (Division 1). Our Athletics Team also won numerous prizes, including two Champions, two 2nd Runners-up, and one third Runners-up. In addition, Chung Tak Chak broke the record in 5000 m run in the Inter-School Jing Ying Athletics Competition, and he was selected to be the member of the Hong Kong Team to join the 2nd East Asian U20 Athletics Championships. The Rope Skipping Team obtained the championship title in the Open Grade Performance Cup at the HKRSA Elite Championship 2025, and team members received numerous individual

awards at the 2025 International Open Tournament. Notably, student Chen Qinbin won Overall Individual Bronze Medal in the 2025 Junior World Championships.

Our students also actively engaged in community service. We participated in various fund-raising activities. For example, they joined Dress Casual Day 2024 to enhance the social welfare services supported by The Community Chest of Hong Kong. The students also helped sell raffle tickets for Caritas Hong Kong and Catholic Women's League. The Community Youth Club also organized a joint-school activity with St. Rose of Lima College to serve children with vision impairment. Throughout the 2024-2025 school year, our students contributed a remarkable 33,520 hours of community service, both within and outside the school.

School Affairs

Attracted by the quality of education we provide, 307 primary students applied for discretionary places. As the government cap on cohort size at 170, we were able to offer only 51 discretionary places. Through central allocation, 109 students were assigned to our school. To assist the new Form 1 students in developing study skills and adapting to school life, we conducted a comprehensive Pre-S1 Summer Programme.

The total number of teaching staff is 64, including the Native English Teacher (NET) and the Principal. With the Teachers' Relief Grant, we employed one additional full-time teacher. Altogether, we have 65 teachers for the 2024-2025 school year. Among the 64 teachers, by freezing the 4 Teaching Staff Establishment, 5 of them were employed with 1-year contract using the Teachers' Relief Grant. All teachers hold degrees, with 36 possessing a master's degree and two holding a PhD degree. With the Teachers' Relief Grant and Learning Support Grant, we employed 2 teaching assistants for Chinese and English Language support, and one teaching assistant for the Special Educational Needs (SEN). With the Capacity Enhancement Grant and Administration Grant, we employed 2 more teaching assistants—one for the Pastoral Ministry and one to help in the Library.

The Principal and Vice Principals attended a workshop on "The Enhanced School Development and Accountability Framework 2024/25," held by the Education Bureau (EDB) on 9th April 2025. This workshop aimed to enhance schools' understanding of the rationale behind the enhanced SDA framework, thereby improving the effectiveness of school self-evaluation.

Vice Principal Ms. Choi Suk Yan has been appointed as the Chairperson of the Committee for National Security Education. School-based materials and worksheets, including sources and publishing company names, were stored on the school intranet for teachers. Departmental program plans incorporated sessions on National Security Education, and various related activities and exhibitions organized through inter-departmental collaboration. "Speech Under National Flag" was held after the Flag Raising Ceremony starting from 2024-2025, all teachers were required to attend. Our school was paired up with Hanlin Experimental School (Dongguan) in the Sister-School Scheme by EDB, Vice Principal Wu, along with teachers and students, were invited to join the Opening Ceremony of Our 55th Anniversary Open Day.

The 55th Anniversary Committee was established, with five sub-committees dedicated to the Thanksgiving Mass, Open Day, Performance Night, Walkathon and Anniversary Magazine. The 55th School Anniversary Thanksgiving Mass took place on 17th January 2025, at Christ the King Chapel, and was followed by a Staff Lunch at The Regal Hong Kong. The 55th School Anniversary Open Day was held on 28-29th June 2025, and the Performance Night was successfully held on 5th July 2025. The final event of the celebration, the 55th Anniversary

Walkathon, is scheduled for 14 December 2025. Additionally, the 55th Anniversary Magazine is planned for publication during the 2025-2026 school year.

A Quality Education Fund (QEF) project focused on library improvement has been completed. The library was transformed into a self-learning center for students, featured with a self-study area and a comfortable reading zone, as well as a cultural space and a discussion room to promote reading and support students' project work. Another QEF project, aimed at creating a self-learning video archive of HKDSE multiple-choice questions, has also been launched. The Mathematics, Physics, and Chemistry Departments are collaborating to produce video clips that explain these questions.

To integrate core Catholic values across the curriculum, the Life Education Programme will cover all junior students and will become a regular program to promote positive values among them. In the area of environmental conservation, we uphold our commitment to green practices and policies within our school. In addition, our students participated actively in the 2nd 'Youth Decarbonisation Platform' Campus Action cum Campus Decarbonisation Ambassador Programme organized by the HK Federation of Youth Groups. We won the Gold Award of Eco-action Champion Award and Low Carbon Diet Campus Award. Student Li Jia Lin received a Recycling Guru Award in the SGREEN Inter-school Recycling Competition (SGREEN x We-recycle@School Competitions) co-organized by the Ocean Park Hong Kong and the Environmental Protection Department.

To improve the learning environment for our students, we have applied to the EDB for funding for major repairs, which include painting the walls and ceilings of some indoor areas, replacing cabinets with lockers in classrooms, and updating the pipework. We also utilized donations from the Sing Yin Secondary School Education Foundation Limited to upgrade campus facilities and audio-visual equipment.

By the end of the school year, Vice Principal Mrs. Kwok Cheng Mei Ling, teachers Mr. Kwok Wai Keung, Mr. Chu Wang Kei and Finance Secretary Ms. Chan Yin Yee retired. Mr. Cheng Kwan Ho, Mr. Chui Chun Yin and Mr. Leung Basil Justin Serrano resigned for personal reasons. We greatly appreciate their dedicated service.

Report on School's Major Concerns

There were three major concerns for the 2024-2025 school year.

1. To promote among students the positive values conducive to their whole person development

Achievements and Reflection

Departments across the school prioritized the cultivation of positive values, often integrating them directly into the curriculum and extracurricular activities. To assist teachers in creating student programs, a series of educational talks, workshops, and sharing sessions were organized for staff at various levels, including new teachers, middle managers, and administrative personnel.

Through the co-ordination of the school Catholic Education Committee, the talk on 'Catholic Core Values' was held for all staff and all students during the Religious Week in May, 2025 in the school hall. Another talk related to positive values was held by the Vice Principal in the school chapel in the Religious Week.

Catholic Education Committee, Religious and Moral Education Department, and Community Services Department has joined hands with organizing a volunteering activity for the Form 3 Life Education Programme to promote volunteering and positive values conducive to whole person development. Parish-School co-operation programme on 'Education Day of Catholic Schools' also helped instill students' core values of Catholic education as well as the priority values promoted by EDB.

With the help of the frontline Religious and Moral Education teachers, guidance teachers and class teachers, the sharing and follow-up sessions were conducted in the Religious and Moral Education lessons and the Class Periods organised by the Religious and Moral Education Department and the Guidance Department respectively. In the first year of the development cycle, F1 and F2 Life Education Programme was launched. The theme of the F1 Life Education Programme was 'Nature and Me'. And the theme of the F2 Life Education Programme was 'My neighbours and Me'. The Life Education Program has been extended to Form 3 in the second year of our development cycle. The theme was "Community and Me."

All academic departments also prioritized and emphasized several positive values in their curricula. For example, the Chinese Language & Literature Department integrated priority values such as courtesy, filial piety, fraternity, and the love of nature directly into the lower-form curriculum and public displays, while also partnering with the PTA to involve students in the library renovation to foster commitment and responsibility. Similarly, the Citizenship and Social Development (CSD) curriculum integrated values like respect, responsibility, and national identity, leading to high participation in related online quizzes. Elements of positive values were included in the junior form Integrated Science. Students behaved well during experiments, showing respect for others and a pursuit for truth and the importance of resilience in Science investigation. The elements on putting the positive values into action were instilled in the lessons.

Another example came from the Geography Department. During the discussions about the causes and effects of global warming, unfair trade, deforestation and sustainable development, the positive values were emphasized. Students were asked to buy products with the labels of

Fair Trade, and to take action in their daily lives to save energy, save water and lead a low-carbon life to show care and love for the Earth and to sustain all life on Earth.

There are further examples from the cultural subjects. In the music curriculum, songs with the core values were introduced and students were encouraged to promote and put the values in action, for example, showing love to family through singing 'Truly Love You'. Students showed their love of God through singing and performing in mass and prayer meetings. Through the co-operation and collaboration of the Visual Arts Department, a series of art appreciation lessons on the sculpture of "Pieta" created by Michelangelo was arranged for F.1 students during the Religious Week. During P.E. lessons, positive values were instilled to the students in the sports events, emphasizing the importance of friendship, co-operation and fairness in competitions.

The Reading Across Curriculum Committee hosted a "Human Library" event where staff and alumni shared personal stories to promote the value of love. The Discipline Department reinforced this foundation by holding a series of talks on discipline and weekly short talks on core values, leading to demonstrable improvements in student behavior. Even the Aesthetic Development and Science departments played a role, with the former hosting a workshop to cultivate Catholic values and the latter stressing responsibility and respect during hands-on experiments.

Functional groups, ECA clubs including the Catholic Society and committees organised regular school activities and programmes to help students put the core values of Catholic into action, for example, the household energy-saving competition was held and about 70 families entered the competition and a parent-student low-carbon cooking competition on video was organised by the Environmental Education Committee. Educational talks for parents on the National Security Education (Cyber Security and Science & Technology Security) were held by Internet Professional Association on 20 March 2024, and positive feedback was received.

Feedback and Follow-up

The school's follow-up efforts are geared toward continuous reinforcement and raising the standard for positive behavior and attitudes. Students will be encouraged to apply what they learnt from the positive values through extra-curricular activities and service projects to the community.

Building on this successful foundation, the primary focus for the next cycle will be sustaining and expanding the scope of the most impactful initiatives. The newly extended F.1 to F.3 Life Education Programme (with themes like 'Nature and Me,' 'My neighbours and Me,' and 'Community and Me') will be maintained as a core platform for whole-person development. The school will seek to deepen the positive collaboration models established, such as the volunteering activity within the Form 3 Life Education Programme and the Parish-School co-operation, to continue instilling core Catholic and EDB-promoted values. The Discipline Department is committed to strengthening the delivery of positive values directly in class and will implement measures to raise the overall standard requirement for students. Correspondingly, the Chinese Language department plans to organize similar programs to further cultivate values like commitment and will continue its theme-based curriculum, which places explicit emphasis on positive values. In Physical Education, teachers will introduce different methods for grouping students to actively promote the value of collaboration and teamwork among those who have previously struggled with group formation. Furthermore, the Citizenship & Social Development curriculum will enhance engagement and interest in national

identity by awarding prizes to outstanding students who participate in online quizzes on national knowledge and basic law. The successful integration of values into curriculum subjects will be sustained, with teachers continuing to instill elements of putting positive values into action, similar to the action-based learning utilized by the Geography Department.

Through the co-operation and collaboration among different departments, clubs and other parties, for example, Parent- Teacher Association, the programmes organised by the school Catholic Education Committee were successfully implemented in May. More parties will also be invited to help the activities, for example, Alumni Association. Teachers will continue to refine a variety of activities to help students put the core values of Catholic Education into action.

2. To broaden students' horizons in terms of their diverse potentials and aspirations

Achievements and Reflection

All departments actively connected students with the outside world in order to achieve the goal of Broadening Horizons and Fostering Diverse Aspirations. Our school actively encouraged all departments and interest clubs to promote student participation in a wide array of activities, competitions, and community services. This strategy created multiple pathways for students to explore their potential and excel beyond the standard curriculum. On the academic front, Geography students won five medals at the Hong Kong Geography Olympiad, with one student selected to represent Hong Kong internationally in Thailand, showcasing excellence in the humanities. In STEM fields, students demonstrated remarkable performance in Informatics and Coding, securing a Gold Medal in the Hong Kong Olympiad in Informatics (HKOI) and a Silver Medal in the Hong Kong Secondary School Coding Challenge. Two students even represented Hong Kong at the International Olympiad level in Astronomy & Astrophysics and Physics, earning Honorable Mentions.

Furthermore, the History Department's focus on hands-on learning led to five Form Three students winning the Championship of the Junior Division in a prestigious Project Learning Competition on Hong Kong's History and Culture. The arts and sports departments were equally active: the Drama Team won multiple awards, including Outstanding Script and Outstanding Director at the Hong Kong School Drama Festival, and the Symphonic Band and String Orchestra both achieved Gold Awards in the Joint School Music Competition. In sports, the Badminton Team earned the Overall Champion in their division, and an athlete broke a record in the Inter-School Jing Ying Athletics Competition before being selected for the Hong Kong Team. Finally, to instill a service ethic, students actively engaged in community service, contributing a remarkable 33,520 hours to various causes, including helping children with vision impairment, demonstrating that meaningful aspirations extend to civic responsibility.

Another significant strategy involved leveraging the school's Alumni network. The Chinese Language & Literature Department collaborated with the alumni to invite high-achieving "old boys" to share their varied life paths. These guests highlighted success in non-traditional and challenging fields, such as the youngest person to complete the highly demanding Hong Kong Four Trails Ultra Challenge and an expert in Chinese calligraphy. This initiative was specifically designed to demonstrate to students that success is multi-faceted, their talents are valuable, and their career aspirations can be highly diverse. Culturally, the Chinese Language and Citizenship and Social Development (CSD) departments partnered to join the Jockey Club ICH+ Innovative Heritage Education Programme. This initiative provided F4 and F5 students with valuable

hands-on experience by learning traditional skills like Chinese Cheongsam sewing and paper crafting directly from professional craft masters, thereby enlightening them on a wider range of vocational and creative aspirations rooted in cultural heritage.

Concurrently, academic departments provided focused professional exposure: the Chemistry Department arranged for F4 and F5 students to attend a specialized Career Workshop at the Government Laboratory, providing them with detailed talks and practical tryouts in the field of testing and certification. In the realm of pure science, the Biology Department arranged for all F5 Biology students to attend a high-profile lecture, "The Next Scientist Talk on Life," delivered by Professor Dennis Lo, with the explicit aim of inspiring their scientific and technological thinking. Finally, the Extra-curricular Activities Department focused on pushing personal and social boundaries by nominating students for the challenging Outward Bound Program. This involved partnering with professional trainers and interacting with peers from different schools, which helped push students' physical and mental potential while exposing them to new social dynamics and diverse perspectives.

Feedback and Follow-up

The school will increase efforts to broaden students' perspectives through expert interaction and specialized programs. Based on the exceptional outcomes and positive feedback, the following strategies will be implemented to consolidate gains and further expand student horizons:

We will transition the informal sharing sessions into a structured, longitudinal Alumni Mentorship Program. This involves formally matching high-achieving alumni from diverse fields (including arts administration, start-ups, and international development) with senior-form students based on expressed interests. This aims to provide continuous guidance rather than one-off inspiration.

The success of the F4 and F5 specialized workshops highlights the need for earlier exposure. We will pilot a "Discover Your Potential" rotational workshop series for Form Two students, covering five distinct pathways (Creative Arts, Applied STEM, Entrepreneurship, Global Citizenship, and Vocational Skills) to inform subject choices and aspirations at a foundational level.

Given the impressive service hours recorded, the school will formally integrate 10 hours of mandatory, reflection-based service learning into the Form Four Citizenship and Social Development (CSD) curriculum. This ensures that the ethos of civic responsibility is universally experienced and academically reflected upon by all students.

To maintain the high standard of academic and non-academic achievement seen in the Olympiads, Drama, and Sports, departments will be tasked with creating sustained, year-long training pipelines. The focus will shift from general recruitment to targeted, elite training programs that leverage departmental expertise and external professional coaches.

3. To further develop students' creativity and innovativeness

Achievements and Reflection

The school successfully addressed its major concern, "To further develop students' creativity and innovativeness," through a variety of targeted, inter-departmental, and hands-on initiatives

throughout the past school year. A key strategy involved immersing students in authentic, complex problem-solving scenarios across both academic and co-curricular domains.

To help students unleash their creativity and innovativeness, all departments and functional groups organized opportunities for them to join various interschool and international activities and competitions. For example, the STEAM Education Committee championed Project-Based Learning (PBL), requiring students to research, collaborate, and apply their knowledge creatively to real-world problems. A major achievement was the strategy to integrate AI into learning and teaching to improve effectiveness; this included piloting the development and use of AI tools and encouraging the design thinking process to enhance divergent thinking. Specifically, the Physics and Integrated Science departments showcased true innovation by developing and utilizing simulation applications powered by the AI tool, Gemini. These AI-enabled resources were integrated into lessons to help teach complex phenomena, like concepts of force and motion, facilitating student engagement and deeper conceptual understanding. Experiential learning will be expanded by the Biology Department, which plans to organize more outdoor learning activities and relaunch its highly motivating Augmented Reality (AR) workshop, utilizing a generous donation of forty AR headsets.

The focus on creativity extended into the humanities and co-curricular spheres. The History and Religious and Moral Education (RME) departments collaborated to organize a joint Model International Conference for Form 3 students, challenging them to brainstorm and propose innovative solutions to global issues like internet security. Furthermore, the History Department's emphasis on original research through project work for junior forms yielded concrete results, with a student team winning the championship in the junior category of the Inter-school Competition of Project Learning on Hong Kong's History and Culture, demonstrating high-level skills in original judgment and presentation.

Outside of the core curriculum, the Aesthetic Development department provided platforms to spark creativity through original work by encouraging student participation in competitions requiring original playwriting or dance creation, resulting in prestigious awards for Outstanding Script and Outstanding Director in external festivals. Finally, the Physical Education Department fostered practical problem-solving and creativity by empowering students to take ownership of major school events, allowing them to both create artwork for publicity and organize complex activities, successfully developing their organizational, leadership, and problem-solving skills in a real-world context.

Feedback and Follow-up

The school's multi-pronged approach to fostering creativity and innovativeness demonstrated significant success across both academic and co-curricular domains, with technological innovation being a major highlight in inter-departmental collaboration. To sustain and scale these successful initiatives, the focus for the next development cycle will be on formalizing advanced training and leveraging technology further. In the sciences, the departments must continue to develop and refine the AI-enabled Gemini simulation apps and explore adapting this high-engagement model for other subjects within the STEAM curriculum. The Aesthetic departments will continue to support and encourage original artistic entries into external festivals, viewing these competitions as essential platforms for creative expression and recognition.

Furthermore, collaboration between departments will be encouraged to hold more activities related to creativity and innovativeness. We will also focus on leveraging the success of the

championship-winning teams by implementing a structured mentorship or sharing programmes. The successful model of student ownership piloted will be reviewed for application across other major school events, maximizing opportunities for students to apply their creativity to real-world organizational and problem-solving challenges.

School Management and Staff Consultation

In the 2024-2025 school year, the school was managed, administered and operated by the Incorporated Management Committee in accordance with the Constitution laid down by the IMC which shall comply with the Education Ordinance and the code of aid for secondary schools.

The IMC was composed of 8 SVD managers appointed by the Sponsoring Body, 1 parent manager and 1 alternate parent manager, 1 teacher manager and 1 alternate teacher manager, 1 alumni manager and 1 independent manager.

The registered SVD Managers were Rev. Johnson Dhos, Supervisor and the Chairperson of the IMC, Rev. Paul Chen Zhong Xue, Rev. Balubun Anthonius Reynolds, Rev. Mullackal Chakkappan Manoj, Rev. Suryanto Natalius, Rev. John Baptist Le Van Ba, and Rev. Flandez Jay Francis Roa. Rev. Venus Arjay Apinado was the Alternate SVD Manager.

The Teacher Manager was Mr. Li Sze Fuk and the Alternate Teacher Manager was Ms. Yang Ka Wah. The Parent Manager was Ms. Iong Un Lan and the Alternate Parent Manager was Ms. Leung Yuk Yin. The Alumni Manager was Mr. Lee Pui Keung and the Independent Manager was Mr. Wong Chi Keung.

Mrs. Kwok Cheng Mei Ling, Ms Choi Suk Yan and Mr. Yung Lit Hung, the Vice Principals, attended IMC meetings by invitation.

Our school's administrative arrangements emphasize staff consultation. There were three consultative committees: the Academic Affairs Committee, the Student Support Committee and the Teachers' Affairs Committee to discuss matters related to academic affairs, student affairs and staff welfare respectively. These three committees aimed at providing optimal opportunity for consultation between the principal and the teaching staff. Besides, staff meetings were held about four times per school year. Apart from reporting, these meetings also aimed to collect the opinion of teachers. After consultation, sometimes decisions were made by the principal. For important matters, the final decision was made by the IMC.

Routine decisions were made by the Principal and the Executive Committee. This committee made up of the Principal and the three Vice Principals met about once a week.

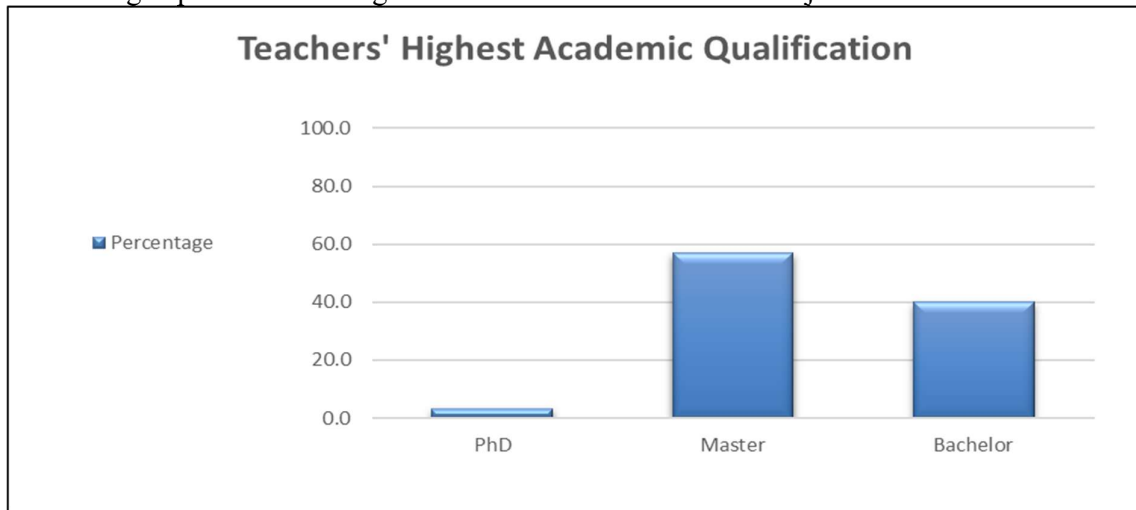
Staff Profile

a. Teachers' Establishment

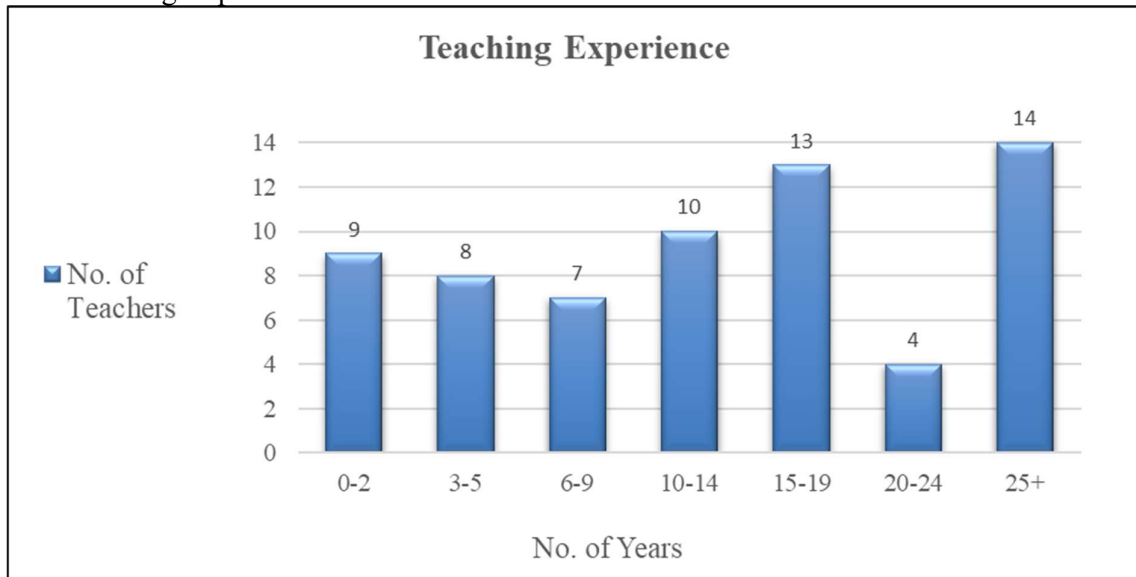
The number of teachers stood at 65. There were 31 male teachers and 34 female teachers. One of them was an English native-speaker. In addition, there were 4 technicians, 6 office staff members, 13 janitors and 6 teaching assistants. Among the teachers, 15 were Catholics.

b. Teachers' Qualification

Among the 65 teachers, all held bachelor's degrees, 2 had doctoral degrees and 37 possessed master's degrees. In addition, 62 had received professional training, and 44 had over 10 years of teaching experience. All English and Chinese teachers were subject-trained.

d. Teachers' Continuing Professional Development Report

This year, teachers dedicated a total of 2,422 hours to continuing professional development, averaging 37.26 hours per teacher. Three staff development days were held.

First Staff Development Day: 26 September 2024 - The day began with a morning seminar on "Development Ladder for Teenagers: Designing and Implementing Whole-person Development Education in Schools". Following this, a tour of the newly renovated school library was conducted. In the afternoon, Dr. Hui Wai Ting shared insights on National Security Education, helping teachers to understand its importance of National Security, as well as equipping them with strategies to integrate these concepts into their teaching practices.

Second Staff Development Day: 24 January 2025 - This session began with a Succulent Mini Garden Workshop and a Chinese Acupressure Massage Workshop. A seminar on 'Exploring the Future of Humanities' and 'What is Digital Humanities?' was held. In the afternoon, a Teacher Thematic tour in the M+ museum provided an opportunity for teaching staff to engage with contemporary art, foster interdisciplinary connections.

Third Staff Development Day: 3 May 2025 - Pilgrimage was arranged in Celebrating Sing Yin Secondary School 55th Anniversary & The SVD 150th Anniversary & Jubilee 2025.

An online survey indicated unanimous agreement among teachers that the development programs were well-organized, achieved their objectives, and were both useful and inspiring. Additionally, over 95% of teachers expressed satisfaction with the overall arrangements and found the information applicable to their work.

e. Principal's Continuing Professional Development Report

In the 2024-2025 school year, Principal Dr. Hui Chi Kuen logged a total of 245 CPD hours, significantly exceeding the mandated requirement of 50 hours. Dr. Hui also completed the Diploma in Religious and Moral Education in Catholic Schools, organized by Saint Francis University Hong Kong and the Holy Spirit Institute of Philosophy.

Dr. Hui, along with Mr. Cheung, the Science Panel Head, was invited to participate in the "Exchange cum Training Programme for STEAM Education Leaders" from 14 to 18 April 2025. In addition, Dr. Hui serves as the Chief Examiner (Chemistry) for the HKEAA, contributing to assessment and curriculum development. He is also a part-time lecturer in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at CUHK, where he shares his expertise through lectures, workshops, and conferences.

Student Profile

a. General

On 1 September 2024, the student enrolment was 939, with 170, 164, 165, 150, 147 and 141 in F1 to F6 respectively. One of the reasons for the decrease of students was the students' withdrawal from school. 6 students withdrew during the school year. About 77% lived in Kwun Tong District. 6% of the students are Catholics while most students did not have any religion. The median family monthly income was \$31,605.00.

b. Reading Habit

Students borrowed 1,309 books from the school library. The monthly average issue rate was 131. This allowed students more time to choose books and could increase the number of book checkouts.

The class size in Form 1 has to be reduced according to EDB's regulation. This year the class size was 34.

All the allocated Form 1 students are basically in Band 1. Some of the students who were weaker in English and Chinese would be allocated in Form 1A. Double manning was adopted in the English and Chinese Language lessons. There is no streaming policy for Form 2 and 3. All the 5 classes in each form 2 and 3 are more or less of the same academic standard.

Streaming starts in Form 4 and students are allocated into 5 classes according to their preferences and their academic standards. Form 4 students have to study 4 core subjects – English, Chinese, Maths Citizenship and Social Development and 3 electives.

Curriculum

The design of our curriculum centers on our mission - to enable students to live a full life; a life that is healthy, affluent and meaningful.

To live a meaningful life, one must have proper values. In Sing Yin, we treasure Christian and good Chinese values the most. Consequently, we allocate two lessons per cycle throughout the 6 years of schooling on moral and civic education. These are supported by many other programs and activities outside of lesson hours.

Apart from moral development, we aim to provide a broad education through a balance of subjects. There is a balanced curriculum in academic and cultural subjects. Furthermore, a great variety of options of academic subjects are offered to our Form 4 to Form 6 students.

a. Religious and Moral Education

From the time it was founded in 1970, our school has always emphasized the moral development of our students through both formal and informal means. Moral Education is formally taught, with two periods per cycle, in all classes, from Form 1 to Form 6. In the mid-90s' with the approach of Hong Kong's return to China, Civic Education is incorporated with the objective of helping students to better understand and know our country. A range of activities is organized to foster moral development and civic duties of the students. These include Morning Reflection, weekly prayers, talks, visits and community services. Please refer to the departmental report for more details.

It is through formal teaching and various activities that help our students to develop into citizens who love themselves, their neighbour and their country, set their eyes on the district, help build Hong Kong, care about their Mother land and embrace the world.

Our school further aims to expand the spiritual horizons of our students, introducing them to Christian principles, values, and beliefs to help them find a deeper meaning in life. Students are formally introduced to the Catholic faith and Christian beliefs through scheduled Religious and Moral Education (RME) lessons, where they are given opportunities to reflect upon and judge the worth of these principles for their own lives. This includes the implementation of the Life Education Programme, which has been extended to Form 3. Simultaneously, we strive to deepen the faith of our Catholic students and introduce them to the joy of the Gospel through diverse religious activities, such as special programs held every Tuesday afternoon. The Catholic Society further supports this mission by organizing retreats, the Way of the Cross, visits, and community service for its members. Other annual activities woven into the school year include a Prayer Service for the new school term and morning mass for students from F1 to F5, alongside Catechumen classes offered to those who are interested in discerning the faith.

The Religious and Moral Education Department has been led by Rev. John Zhang Xinghao, S.V.D., since he joined Sing Yin Secondary School in 2012. Given the significant and extensive workload for the department's teachers in managing these numerous activities, the school has wisely employed a dedicated Pastoral Ministry to assist with the coordination and implementation of all Catholic-focused activities, ensuring the successful continuation of this vital aspect of school life.

b. Period Allocation For Subjects

The timetable is made up of a 6-day cycle consisting 48 periods. F4 to F6 students have 4 core subjects and 3 electives.

e. Medium of Instruction

Our school aims at trilingualism in English, Cantonese and Putonghua, and biliteracy in English and Chinese for all students. Of course the proficiency level expected for each of these languages differs. In spoken language, we expect students to speak excellent Cantonese, fluent English and reasonable Putonghua. In written language, we expect them to write excellent Chinese and English.

English is adopted as the medium of instruction for all subjects other than Putonghua and Chinese subjects, P.E., Visual Art, and RME. An English Teacher was appointed as the Chairperson of the English Language Across the Curriculum (LAC) Committee. Since 1999, a native-speaking English teacher (NET) has been employed to give additional support to other teachers and our students. Usually, during the summer holiday, a short English programme is organized for new Form 1 students.

In 2010, the EDB announced the new policy “Fine-tuning of MOI”. However, we were not affected at all. Our present MOI is the same as before, that is, English is our major medium of instruction for all classes. Analysis revealed that our students’ academic achievement is not compromised.

Extra-curricular Activities

A wide range of activities is organized outside regular school hours. They provide students the opportunity to discover their interests and their creativity, discover their potential, develop their leadership qualities and improve their communication skills. All students are benefited by taking part in good leisure activities which will help them to be physically and psychologically healthy, and refraining from bad pastimes.

Through participation in extra-curricular activities, we aim at enhancing a sense of belonging and brotherhood of Sing Yin boys through horizontal and vertical integration of both teachers and students. Hence there is nothing “extra” about extra-curricular activities. Sing Yin looks upon these activities as an integral part of the education we offer. Students are expected to treat the activities just like formal lessons. For example, once they sign up for an activity, they have the duty to attend it. If necessary, they have to follow the procedures for asking for leaves.

Students are free to join the clubs. They are expected to be a member of at least one club and remain active members throughout the school year. F.1 to F.5 students should devote more time on ECA. They are encouraged to join one club for a number of years to deepen their knowledge and skill in a particular area that interests them the most. They should also join other clubs for a year or so to broaden their interests. F.6 students should put their focus back on their study, joining one club is an appropriate balance.

The Students' Association was set up in the mid-70s' and has since been playing a very active role in the school. Its executive committee is elected by students. Apart from serving as a bridge between the students and the school by reflecting students' opinion and making suggestions for the welfare of the students, it also provides services and organizes many activities such as the sale of stationary, subscription and distribution of newspaper, blood donation, and many others.

There were 61 ECA clubs to cater for different interests of students. The academic clubs provide opportunities for students to gain knowledge and experience to supplement the formal curriculum. The interest clubs provide chances for students to take part in inter-school competitions, to participate in outdoor activities, visits and outdoor training and fund-raising activities. The Catholic Society organizes weekly Catholic lessons and religious activities for the faith formation of Catholic students, guides students to discover Christian values and beliefs; and to enhance their spiritual and moral development. The Community Service Group organizes activities for the community. Through these real life experiences, our students are enriched with the best possible set of values by which to live a meaningful life. The Sing Yin Pioneers, the Catholic Society, Scouts, the Student Association also organize community service programmes.

Life-wide Learning (LWL) is an educational strategy that takes students out of the traditional classroom setting to learn in authentic environments. Two LWL Days are assigned, starting from the 2024–2025 school year, to help students achieve the aims of whole-person development and enable them to develop the lifelong learning capabilities that are needed in our ever-changing society.

There are post-exam activities for F1- F5 students. The activity programme is organized after the final exam in early July. The activities include talks on topics of interest, cultural performance, quizzes, singing contest, sports games, visits and field trips, etc. In the 61 ECA clubs, there were 2241 members. On average, each student joined 2.39 clubs. The total club expenditure was \$48,503.04. Please note that the total expenditure excluded the costs/fees of training courses, which were much higher than these expenses.

Support For Students

Sing Yin adopts a whole school approach to support students. Every staff member- teachers, office staff, teaching assistants, and janitors are there to help our students. Students are also encouraged to help fellow schoolmates. Students in need can approach any staff member or suitable fellow students for help. Of course, there are times when professional help should be provided. In these cases, students will be referred to our school social workers.

For daily life problems, students can approach fellow students for help. Our Sing Yin Pioneers, Prefects, Student Association and Club officials are all there to help. Of course, Class Teacher and subject teachers are there to help too.

Any student who wishes to talk over personal problem is encouraged to do so with his Class Teacher. However, if the student should, for any reason, prefer to talk to someone other than his Class Teacher, he may approach his subject teachers or a member of the departments listed below.

- a. Guidance Department - it aims to help students develop positive self-concepts, achieve personal growth and interpersonal skills, and realize their own potential to the full. Together with the student support team, led by the SEN coordinator, a team of counseling teachers and a social worker organizes and conducts both preventive and developmental programs to meet these objectives. The programmes include personal growth groups, peer tutoring groups, leadership training programmes and orientation programmes. The Department also organizes Parents' Day to promote better communication between school and parents. All along the school adopts the "Whole School Approach to Guidance" to provide better service to the students.
- b. Careers Department - it aims to prepare students to make sound decisions on further education and career opportunities. Through visits to organizations and exhibitions, talks, seminars, information on education, employment and training opportunities is disseminated to assist students in making the right choice.
- c. Discipline Department - it aims to ensure good manners and good order in each classroom and throughout the school, to foster a healthy school culture in which effective teaching and learning can take place. Students are encouraged to develop self-discipline, to respect the rights and property of others and to attain a high standard of behaviour. They shall be responsible for their own behaviour and breaches of school rules may incur some penalty. However punishment will be accompanied by efforts to teach students the appropriate behaviour so that they can learn to be self-disciplined. As a preventive measure our school is adopting the Whole School Approach to Guidance and Discipline whereby all teachers participate actively in assisting students to resolve their problems. Students who suffer from discipline problems can approach any teachers for help. If necessary, they will be referred to discipline team members.
- d. Health & Safety Department
We also have a team of teachers to provide guidance on health related problems. They give advice students on physical health, mental health and fitness issues.
- e. Financial Support to students
Besides emotional support, we also offer financial support to our students. Using government funds, donated funds or our own funds, we offer financial subsidy for needy

students to support their extra-curricular activities organized by Sing Yin, including training courses, study tours and graduate dinners. In particular, in the 2024-2026 school year, \$74,184.00 from the School-based After-school Learning and Support Programme was used to subsidize 26 needy students. The \$109,570.00 from the Student Activities Support Grant helped subsidize 100 students. Their personal and social development and community involvement improved moderately.

Students' Performance

a. Students' Service

Students have the opportunity to take up voluntary social service through the Community Service Group, Community Youth Club, Sing Yin Pioneers, Catholic Society and Boy Scouts. Other organizations also contribute. Moreover, students have abundant chances to serve their fellow schoolmates in school.

This year, through the five groups mentioned above and programmes run by the Community Services Department, our students provided 33,520 hours of social service in this school year, with an average of 35.7 hours per person. The service hour exceeded the standard of 2000 hours set by the Heart to Heart Programme organized by the Hong Kong Federation of Youth, which we joined in 2006.

On the Dress Casual Day (31/10/2024), the Students' Association raised a total amount of \$7409.5. On the Blood Donation Day (7/1/2025), a total of 14 students and staff donated blood.

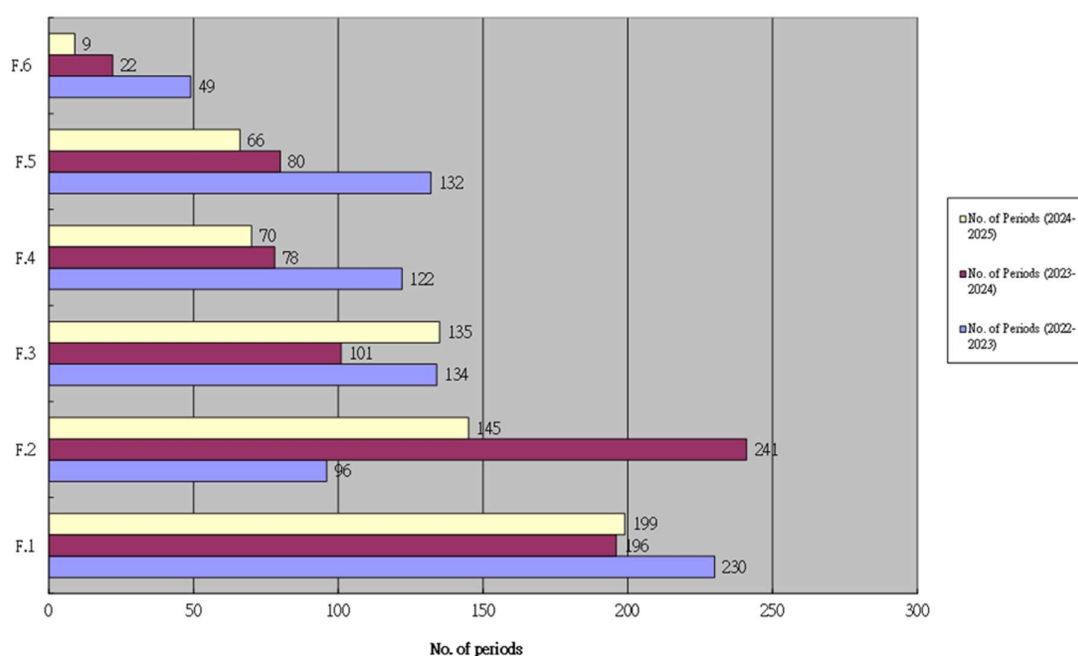
b. Students' Discipline

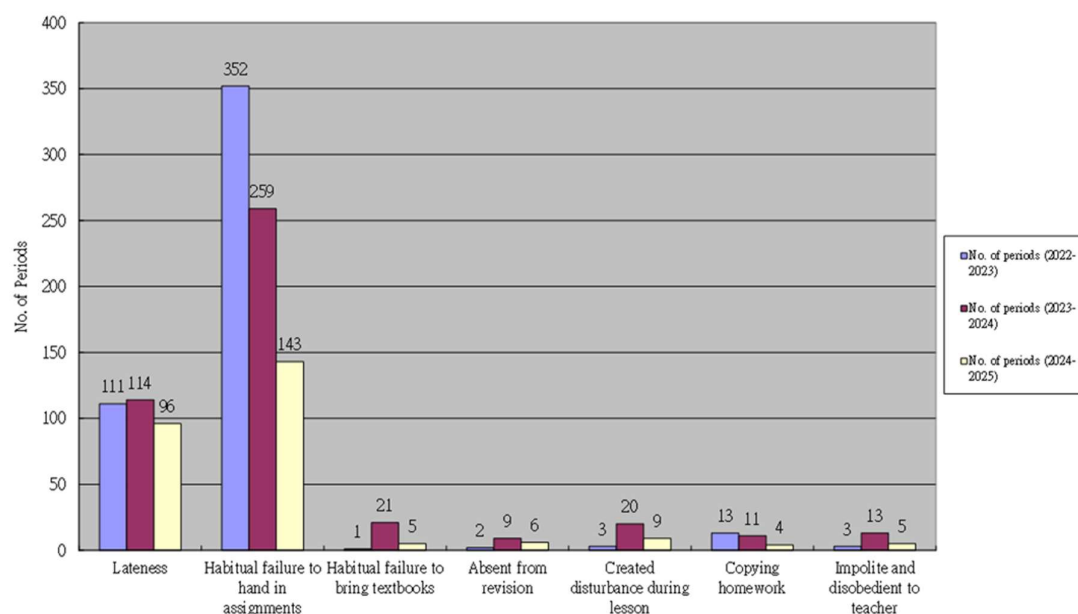
Through these efforts and all our teachers' efforts, our students behaved very well. Their attendance rates and punctuality rates stood above 96% and 99% respectively.

The number of suspension from lessons was 16 and detention periods on Saturdays was 523. 27.3% of the offending students were detained because they failed to hand in their assignments habitually.

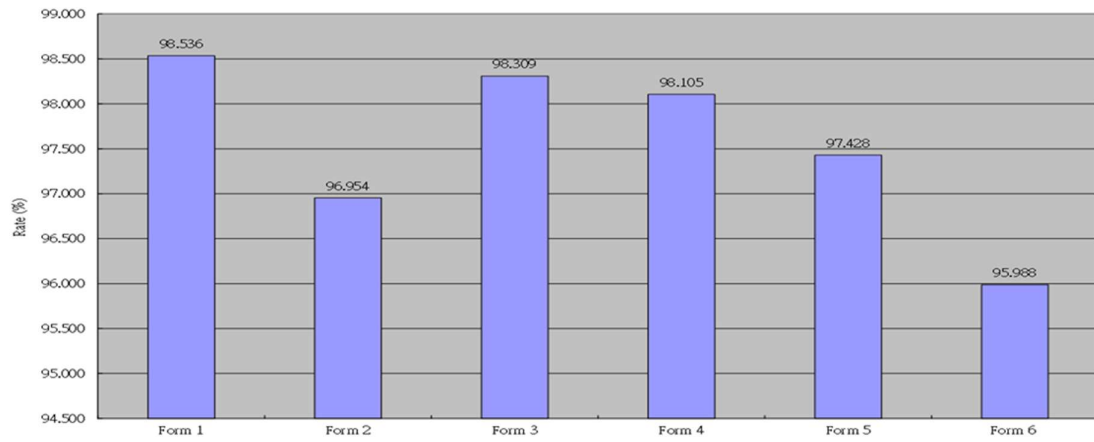
Distribution of the detention periods on Saturdays (2022-2025)



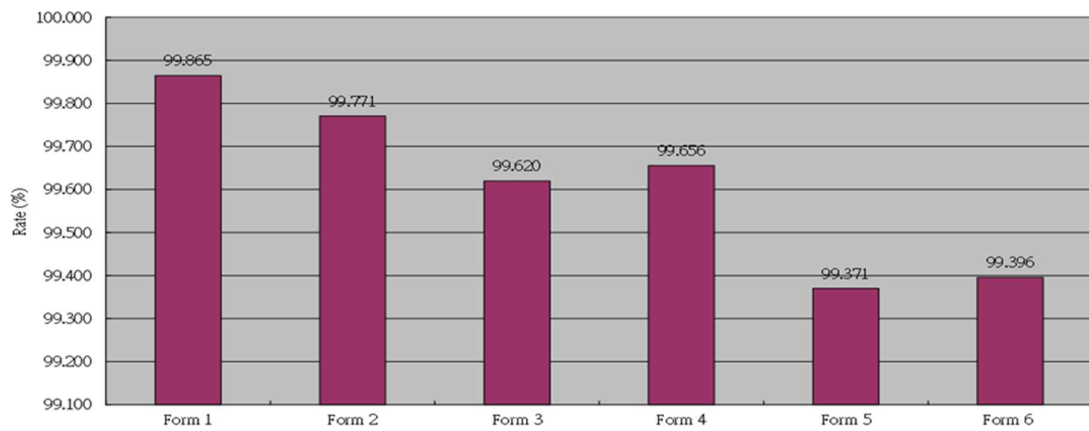
Common Reasons of the Students to have periods of Detention (2022-2025)



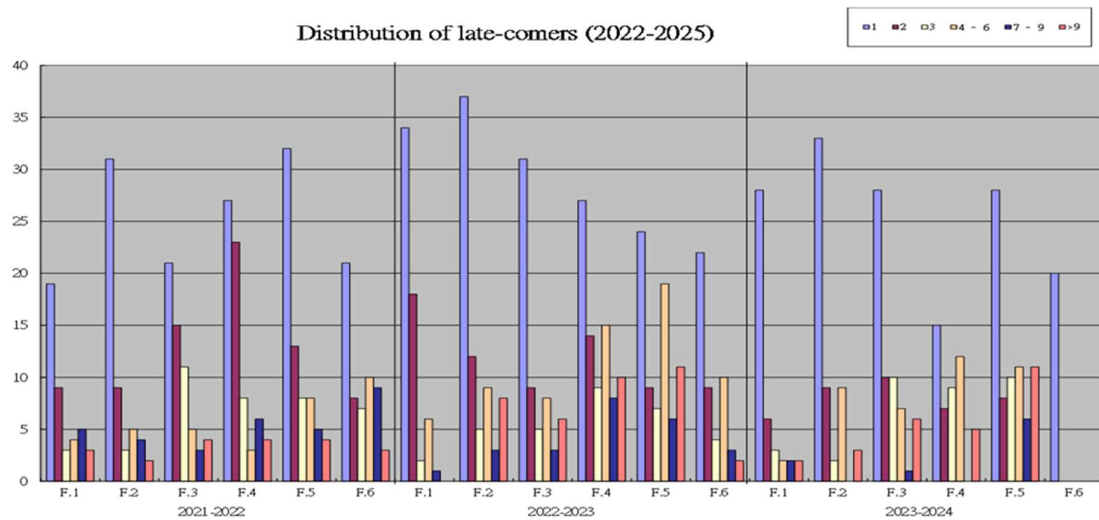
Attendance Rate of Student in 2024-2025



Punctuality Rate of Student in 2024-25



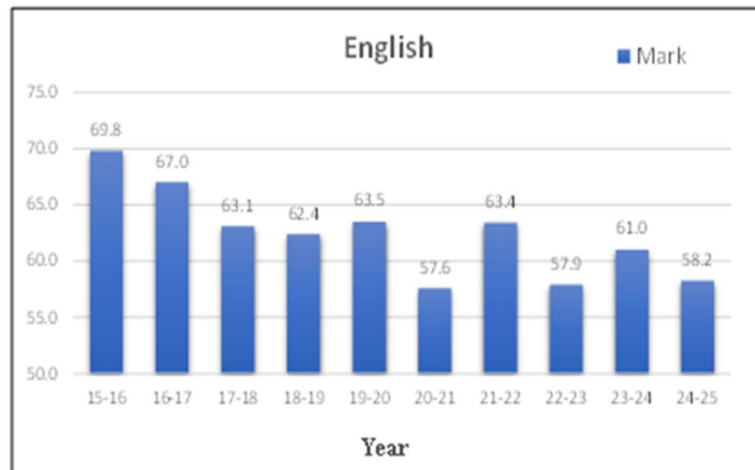
Distribution of late-comers (2022-2025)
